6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 552.148 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 552.148. EXCEPTION: BIRTH DATE AND OTHER IDENTIFYING</u>
10 <u>INFORMATION OF GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE.</u> (a) This
11 <u>section does not apply to information described by Section</u>

(b) The birth date of a current or former official or employee of a governmental body and any other information about such a person that in reasonable probability could be used for the purpose of identity theft is excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021.

(c) A governmental body may redact the birth date of a current or former official or employee of the governmental body from any information the governmental body discloses under Section 552.021 without the necessity of requesting a decision from the attorney general under Subchapter G.

23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
