- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 108, Family Code, is amended by adding
- 7 Section 108.111 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 108.111. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CHILD'S IDENTIFICATION
- 9 INFORMATION. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision in this
- 10 title, information specifically identifying a child in a suit
- 11 affecting the parent-child relationship, including the child's
- 12 social security number, driver's license number, or number of a
- 13 personal identification card issued by the Department of Public
- 14 Safety, contained in an order, petition, motion, report, or other
- 15 document required in this title, is confidential and does not
- 16 constitute public information for purposes of Chapter 552,
- 17 Government Code.
- (b) A court, the Title IV-D agency, or any other person that
- 19 maintains a document described by Subsection (a) containing
- 20 <u>information that is confidential under this section shall ensure</u>
- 21 that the information is excluded from disclosure.
- (c) This section does not apply to the disclosure of
- 23 information between the parties in a suit or to a disclosure to a
- 24 court, the Title IV-D agency, or another person entitled under this

- 1 title to receive the information as long as the disclosure is
- 2 <u>otherwise permitted by law.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to
- 4 information contained in an order, petition, motion, report, or
- 5 other document required under Title 5, Family Code, regardless of
- 6 the date the document was created.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
