4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 33.0813 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.0813. SUSPENSION FROM PARTICIPATION IN
8	EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES. (a) A
9	student who is convicted of a Class C misdemeanor or is found to
10	have engaged in conduct indicating a need for supervision under
11	Section 51.03(b)(1)(A), Family Code, shall be suspended from
12	participating in any extracurricular activity sponsored or
13	sanctioned by a school district or the University Interscholastic
14	League for two consecutive weeks during the 30-day period
15	immediately following the date of the student's conviction or
16	adjudication.
17	(b) A student who is charged with an offense punishable by
18	confinement or who has been referred to juvenile court for
19	allegedly engaging in delinquent conduct under Section
20	51.03(a)(1), Family Code, may not participate in any
21	extracurricular activity sponsored or sanctioned by a school
22	district or the University Interscholastic League during the
23	duration of the criminal or juvenile court proceeding. The
24	suspension of a student imposed under this subsection:

(1) shall be immediately removed if the student is 1 2 found not guilty of the offense charged or found not to have engaged in delinquent conduct; and 3 4 (2) shall be imposed permanently if the student is convicted of the offense charged or found to have engaged in 5 6 delinquent conduct. SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies 7 8 only to an offense committed or conduct that occurs on or after the 9 effective date of this Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed or conduct occurs before the effective date of 10 this Act if any element of the offense or conduct occurs before that 11 date. 12 An offense committed or conduct that occurs before the 13 (b)

effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed or the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
