1	AN ACT
2	relating to regional or local health care programs for employees of
3	small employers.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 75 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 75. REGIONAL OR LOCAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS FOR EMPLOYEES OF
8	SMALL EMPLOYERS
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 75.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to:
11	(1) improve the health of employees of small employers
12	and their families by improving the employees' access to health
13	care and by reducing the number of those employees who are
14	uninsured;
15	(2) reduce the likelihood that those employees and
16	their families will require services from state-funded entitlement
17	programs such as Medicaid;
18	(3) contribute to economic development by helping
19	small businesses remain competitive with a healthy workforce and
20	health care benefits that will attract employees; and
21	(4) encourage innovative solutions for providing and
22	funding health care services and benefits.
23	Sec. 75.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
24	(1) "Employee" means an individual employed by an

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1	employer. The term includes a partner of a partnership and the
2	proprietor of a sole proprietorship.
3	(2) "Governing body" means:
4	(A) the commissioners courts of the counties
5	participating in a regional health care program;
6	(B) the commissioners court of a county
7	participating in a local health care program; or
8	(C) the governing body of the joint council,
9	nonprofit entity exempt from federal taxation, or other entity that
10	operates a regional or local health care program.
11	(3) "Local health care program" means a local health
12	care program operating in one county and established for the
13	benefit of the employees of small employers under Subchapter B.
14	(4) "Regional health care program" means a regional
15	health care program operating in two or more counties and
16	established for the benefit of the employees of small employers
17	under Subchapter B.
18	(5) "Small employer" means a person who employed an
19	average of at least two employees but not more than 50 employees on
20	business days during the preceding calendar year and who employs at
21	least two employees on the first day of the plan year.

23	SUBCHAPTER B. REGIONAL OR LOCAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAM
24	Sec. 75.051. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM; MULTICOUNTY
25	COOPERATION. (a) The commissioners court of a county may, by
26	order, establish or participate in a local health care program
27	under this subchapter.

(b) The commissioners courts of two or more counties may, by 1 2 joint order, establish or participate in a regional health care 3 program under this subchapter. 4 Sec. 75.052. GOVERNANCE OF PROGRAM. (a) A regional health 5 care program may be operated subject to the direct governance of the 6 commissioners courts of the participating counties. A local health 7 care program may be operated subject to the direct governance of the commissioners court of the participating county. A regional or 8 9 local health care program may be operated by a joint council, tax-exempt nonprofit entity, or other entity that: 10

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11 (1) operates the program under a contract with the 12 commissioners court or courts, as applicable; or

13 (2) is an entity in which the county or counties 14 participate or that is established or designated by the 15 commissioners court or courts, as applicable, to operate the 16 program.

17 (b) In selecting an entity described by Subsection (a)(1) or 18 (2) to operate a regional or local health care program, the 19 commissioners court or courts, as applicable, shall require, to the 20 extent possible, that the entity be authorized under federal law to 21 accept donations on a basis that is tax-deductible or otherwise 22 tax-advantaged for the contributor.

23 <u>Sec. 75.053. OPERATION OF PROGRAM. A regional or local</u> 24 <u>health care program provides health care services or benefits to</u> 25 <u>the employees of participating small employers who are located</u> 26 <u>within the boundaries of the participating county or counties, as</u> 27 <u>applicable. A program may also provide services or benefits to the</u>

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1	dependents of those employees.
2	Sec. 75.054. PARTICIPATION BY SMALL EMPLOYERS; SHARE OF
3	COST. Subject to Section 75.153, the governing body may establish
4	criteria for participation in a regional or local health care
5	program by small employers, the employees of the small employers,
6	and their dependents. The criteria must require that participating
7	employers and participating employees pay a share of the premium or
8	other cost of the program.
9	Sec. 75.055. ADDITIONAL FUNDING. (a) A governing body may
10	accept and use a gift, grant, or donation from any source to operate
11	the regional or local health care program and to provide services or
12	benefits under the program.
13	(b) A governing body may apply for and receive funding from
14	the health opportunity pool under Subchapter D.
15	(b-1) A governing body may apply for and receive a grant
16	under Subchapter E to support a regional or local health care
17	program. This subsection expires September 1, 2009.
18	(c) A governing body shall actively solicit gifts, grants,
19	and donations to:
20	(1) fund services and benefits provided under the
21	regional or local health care program; and
22	(2) reduce the cost of participation in the program
23	for small employers and their employees.
24	[Sections 75.056-75.100 reserved for expansion]
25	SUBCHAPTER C. HEALTH CARE SERVICES AND BENEFITS
26	Sec. 75.101. ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS AUTHORIZED; PROGRAM
27	OBJECTIVES. In developing a regional or local health care program,

a governing body may provide health care services or benefits as 1 2 described by this subchapter or may develop another type of program to accomplish the purposes of this chapter. A regional or local 3 4 health care program must be developed, to the extent practicable, 5 to: 6 (1) reduce the number of individuals without health 7 benefit plan coverage within the boundaries of the participating 8 county or counties; 9 (2) address rising health care costs and reduce the cost of health care services or health benefit plan coverage for 10 small employers and their employees within the boundaries of the 11 12 participating county or counties; (3) promote preventive care and reduce the incidence 13 of preventable health conditions, such as heart disease, cancer, 14 15 and diabetes and low birth weight in infants; 16 (4) promote efficient and collaborative delivery of health care services; 17 18 (5) serve as a model for the innovative use of health information technology to promote efficient delivery of health care 19 services, reduce health care costs, and improve the health of the 20 21 community; and 22 (6) provide fair payment rates for health care <u>provider</u>s. 23 24 Sec. 75.102. HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN COVERAGE. (a) A regional 25 or local health care program may provide health care benefits to the employees of small employers by purchasing or facilitating the 26 27 purchase of health benefit plan coverage for those employees from a

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1	health benefit plan issuer, including coverage under:
2	(1) a small employer health benefit plan offered under
3	Chapter 1501, Insurance Code;
4	(2) a standard health benefit plan offered under
5	Chapter 1507, Insurance Code; or
6	(3) any other health benefit plan available in this
7	<u>state.</u>
8	(b) The governing body may form one or more cooperatives
9	under Subchapter B, Chapter 1501, Insurance Code.
10	(c) Notwithstanding Chapter 1251, Insurance Code, an
11	insurer may issue a group accident and health insurance policy,
12	including a group contract issued by a group hospital service
13	corporation, to cover the employees of small employers
14	participating in a regional or local health care program. The group
15	policyholder of a policy issued in accordance with this subsection
16	is the governing body or the designee of the governing body.
17	(d) A health maintenance organization may issue a health
18	care plan to cover the employees of small employers participating
19	in a regional or local health care program. The group contract
20	holder of a contract issued in accordance with this subsection is
21	the governing body or the designee of the governing body.
22	Sec. 75.103. OTHER HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS OR PROGRAMS. To the
23	extent authorized by federal law, the governing body may establish
24	or facilitate the establishment of self-funded health benefit plans
25	or may facilitate the provision of health benefit coverage through
26	health savings accounts and high-deductible health plans.
27	Sec. 75.104. HEALTH CARE SERVICES. (a) A regional or local

health care program may contract with health care providers within the boundaries of the participating county or counties to provide health care services directly to the employees of participating small employers and the dependents of those employees.
(b) A governing body that operates a regional or local health care program under this section may require that

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7 participating employees and dependents obtain health care services 8 only from health care providers that contract to provide those 9 services under the program and may limit the health care services 10 provided under the program to services provided within the 11 boundaries of the participating county or counties.

12 (c) A governing body operating a regional or local health 13 care program operated under this section is not an insurer or health 14 maintenance organization and the program is not subject to 15 regulation by the Texas Department of Insurance.

 17 <u>SUBCHAPTER D. TEXAS HEALTH OPPORTUNITY POOL</u>
 18 Sec. 75.151. <u>DEFINITION. In this subchapter</u>, "health

19 <u>opportunity pool" means the pooled fund of state money and federal</u> 20 <u>money established and used in accordance with a waiver under</u> 21 <u>Section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section</u> 22 <u>1315) to the state Medicaid plan.</u>

23 <u>Sec. 75.152.</u> FUNDING AUTHORIZED. Notwithstanding any other 24 <u>law, a regional or local health care program may apply for funding</u> 25 <u>from the health opportunity pool and the pool may provide funding in</u> 26 <u>accordance with this subchapter.</u>

27 Sec. 75.153. ELIGIBILITY FOR POOL FUNDS; STATEWIDE

C.S.H.B. No. 882 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA. To be eligible for funding from money in the 1 2 health opportunity pool that is provided subject to a federal 3 waiver, a regional or local health care program must comply with any requirement imposed under the waiver, including, to the extent 4 5 applicable, any requirement that health care benefits or services 6 provided under the program be provided in accordance with statewide 7 eligibility criteria. 8 [Sections 75.154-75.200 reserved for expansion] 9 SUBCHAPTER E. GRANTS FOR DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS Sec. 75.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 10 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 11 12 Commission. (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive 13 14 commissioner of the commission. Sec. 75.202. GRANT PROGRAM. (a) 15 The executive 16 commissioner may establish a grant program to support the initial 17 establishment and operation of one or more regional or local health 18 care programs as demonstration projects. (b) In selecting grant recipients, the executive 19 commissioner shall consider the extent to which the regional or 20 21 local health care program proposed by the applicant accomplishes 22 the purposes of this chapter and meets the objectives established under Section 75.101. If the executive commissioner establishes a 23 24 grant program under this subchapter, the executive commissioner must select at least one grant recipient operating a regional 25 26 health care program to receive a grant. 27 (c) The commission shall establish performance objectives

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1	for a grant recipient and shall monitor the performance of the grant
2	recipient.
3	Sec. 75.203. REVIEW OF DEMONSTRATION PROJECT; REPORT. Not
4	later than December 1, 2008, the commission shall complete a review
5	of each regional or local health care program that receives a grant
6	under this subchapter and shall submit to the governor, the
7	lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
8	representatives a report that includes:
9	(1) an evaluation of the success of regional and local
10	health care programs in accomplishing the purposes of this chapter;
11	and
12	(2) the commission's recommendations for any
13	legislation needed to facilitate or improve regional and local
14	health care programs.
15	Sec. 75.204. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September
16	1, 2009.
17	SECTION 2. The heading to Subtitle C, Title 2, Health and
18	Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
19	SUBTITLE C. PROGRAMS PROVIDING [INDIGENT] HEALTH CARE BENEFITS AND
20	
	SERVICES
21	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
22	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
23	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
24	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
25	Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
