## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the members and operation of the Public Utility
- 3 Commission of Texas.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 12.051(a), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commission is composed of  $\underline{\text{five}}$  [three]
- 8 commissioners appointed by the governor with the advice and consent
- 9 of the senate.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 12.101, Utilities Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 12.101. COMMISSION EMPLOYEES. The commission shall
- 13 employ:
- 14 (1) an executive director; [and]
- 15 (2) legal clerks described by Section 12.1015; and
- 16 (3) officers and other employees the commission
- 17 considers necessary to administer this title.
- 18 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 12, Utilities Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 12.1015 to read as follows:
- Sec. 12.1015. LEGAL CLERK. (a) On or before the beginning
- of each state fiscal year, the commission shall employ a legal clerk
- for each commissioner to assist the commissioner in performing the
- 23 <u>commissioner's duties during that fiscal year. Each commissioner</u>
- 24 shall choose that commissioner's legal clerk.

- 1 (b) The commission may not employ a person as a legal clerk
- 2 <u>unless the person:</u>
- 3 (1) is an attorney licensed to practice law in this
- 4 state; and
- 5 (2) has not previously been employed as a legal clerk
- 6 under this section.
- 7 <u>(c) A legal clerk serves at the pleasure of the commissioner</u>
- 8 who chose the clerk. The commission, at the request of the
- 9 commissioner who chose the legal clerk, may replace a clerk at any
- 10 time during a state fiscal year.
- 11 (d) A person employed under this section may not serve as a
- 12 legal clerk on or after the beginning of the next state fiscal year.
- SECTION 4. Section 14.057(a), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) A commission order must be in writing and contain
- detailed findings of the facts on which it is passed. A commission
- order relating to a proceeding that is conducted by one or more
- 18 commissioners must be written by the commissioners. The
- 19 commissioners' legal clerks may assist the commissioners in writing
- 20 the order. The commissioners may not delegate authority to write
- 21 the order to other commission staff.
- 22 SECTION 5. Promptly after this Act takes effect, the
- 23 governor shall appoint two additional members to the Public Utility
- 24 Commission of Texas. Of those members, the governor shall
- designate one to serve a term expiring September 1, 2011, and one to
- serve a term expiring September 1, 2013. Until all appointees have
- taken office, a quorum of the commission is a majority of the number

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- 1 of members who are qualified.
- 2 SECTION 6. (a) This Act applies only to a contested case
- 3 filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A contested case
- 4 filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 5 in effect on the date the contested case was filed, and that law is
- 6 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 (b) As soon as possible after the effective date of this
- 8 Act, each commissioner of the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 9 shall employ a legal clerk as required by Section 12.1015,
- 10 Utilities Code, as added by this Act, for the state fiscal year that
- 11 begins September 1, 2007.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
