3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 82.005, Election Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 82.005. ELIGIBILITY FOR EARLY VOTING [BY PERSONAL
7	APPEARANCE]. Any qualified voter is eligible for early voting by
8	<u>mail or</u> personal appearance.
9	SECTION 2. Section 84.001(a), Election Code, is amended to
10	read as follows:
11	(a) To be entitled to vote an early voting ballot by mail, a
12	person [who is eligible for early voting] must make an application
13	for an early voting ballot to be voted by mail as provided by this
14	title.
15	SECTION 3. Section 84.002(a), Election Code, is amended to
16	read as follows:
17	(a) An early voting ballot application must include:
18	(1) the applicant's name and the address at which the
19	applicant is registered to vote;
20	(2) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
21	by an applicant who will be absent from the applicant's [on the
22	ground of absence from the] county of residence on election day, the
23	address outside the applicant's county of residence to which the
24	ballot is to be mailed;

1 (3) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail 2 by an applicant who is 65 years of age or older on election day or has a sickness or physical condition that requires the applicant to 3 reside in a hospital or nursing home or other long-term care 4 facility, or with a relative [on the ground of age or disability], 5 6 the address of the hospital, nursing home or other long-term care facility, or retirement center, or of a person related to the 7 8 applicant within the second degree by affinity or the third degree by consanguinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, 9 if the applicant is living at that address and that address is 10 different from the address at which the applicant is registered to 11 12 vote;

13 (4) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail 14 <u>by an applicant who is confined</u> [on the ground of confinement] in 15 jail <u>as described by Section 84.009(a)</u>, the address of the jail or 16 of a person related to the applicant within the degree described by 17 Subdivision (3); <u>and</u>

18 (5) [for an application for a ballot to be voted by 19 mail on any ground,] an indication of each election for which the 20 applicant is applying for a ballot[; and

21 [(6) an indication of the ground of eligibility for 22 early voting].

23 SECTION 4. Section 84.009, Election Code, is amended by 24 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as 25 follows:

26 (a) <u>This section applies only to an applicant who, at the</u>
 27 <u>time the application for a ballot to be voted by mail is submitted,</u>

1	is confined in jail:
2	(1) serving a misdemeanor sentence for a term that
3	ends on or after election day;
4	(2) pending trial after denial of bail;
5	(3) without bail pending an appeal of a felony
6	conviction; or
7	(4) pending trial or appeal on a bailable offense for
8	which release on bail before election day is unlikely.
9	<u>(a-1)</u> On request of the applicant, an application for a
10	ballot to be voted by mail [on the ground of confinement in jail]
11	may be submitted to the early voting clerk, at the discretion of the
12	authority in charge of the jail, by personal delivery by the jail
13	authority or by a designated subordinate of the authority.
14	SECTION 5. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, is amended to
15	read as follows:
16	(a) The officially prescribed application form for an early
17	voting ballot must include:
18	(1) immediately preceding the signature space the
19	statement: "I certify that the information given in this
20	application is true, and I understand that giving false information
21	in this application is a crime.";
22	(2) a statement informing the applicant of the
23	offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004;
24	(3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter
25	registration number and county election precinct of registration,
26	with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish
27	that information does not invalidate the application; and
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(4)

on an application for a ballot to be voted by mail: 2 (A) a space for an applicant [applying on the ground of absence from the county of residence] to indicate whether 3 the applicant will be absent from the applicant's county of 4 residence on election day and, if applicable, the date on or after 5 6 which the applicant can receive mail at the address outside the 7 county;

8 (B) a space for indicating the fact that an applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the 9 applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or 10 lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant; 11

a space for entering an applicant's telephone 12 (C) number, with a statement informing the applicant that failure to 13 14 furnish that information does not invalidate the application;

15 (D) a space or box for an applicant who is 65 years of age or older on election day or has a sickness or physical 16 condition that requires the applicant to reside in a hospital or 17 nursing home or other long-term care facility, or with a relative 18 [applying on the ground of age or disability] to indicate that the 19 address to which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a 20 21 facility or relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable; 22

a space or box for an applicant confined 23 (E) 24 [applying on the ground of confinement] in jail as described by 25 Section 84.009(a) to indicate that the address to which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a relative described by Section 26 84.002(a)(4), if applicable; 27

(F) spaces for entering the signature, printed
 name, and residence address of any person assisting the applicant;

3 (G) a statement informing the applicant of the
4 condition prescribed by Section 81.005; and

5 (H) a statement informing the applicant of the 6 requirement prescribed by Section 86.003(c).

7 SECTION 6. Sections 86.001(b) and (c), Election Code, are 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (b) If the <u>application complies with the applicable</u> 10 <u>requirements prescribed by this title</u> [applicant is entitled to 11 vote an early voting ballot by mail], the clerk shall provide an 12 official ballot to the applicant as provided by this chapter.

(c) Except as provided by Section 86.008, if the applicant is not entitled to vote <u>in the election</u> [by mail], the clerk shall reject the application, enter on the application "rejected" and the reason for and date of rejection, and deliver written notice of the reason for the rejection to the applicant at both the residence address and mailing address on the application. A ballot may not be provided to an applicant whose application is rejected.

20 SECTION 7. Section 86.003(c), Election Code, is amended to 21 read as follows:

(c) The address to which the balloting materials must be addressed is the address at which the voter is registered to vote, or the registered mailing address if different, unless the <u>application to vote early by mail indicates that the voter</u> [ground for voting by mail is]:

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(1) will be absent from the voter's [absence from the]

county of residence <u>on election day</u>, in which case the address must
 be an address outside the voter's county of residence;

3 (2) <u>is confined</u> [confinement] in jail <u>as described by</u> 4 <u>Section 84.009(a)</u>, in which case the address must be the address of 5 the jail or of a relative described by Section 84.002(a)(4); or

6 (3) is 65 years of age or older on election day or has a sickness or physical condition that requires the applicant to 7 reside in a hospital or nursing home or other long-term care 8 facility, or with a relative, [age or disability] and [the voter] is 9 living at a hospital, nursing home or other long-term care 10 facility, or retirement center, or with a relative described by 11 Section 84.002(a)(3), in which case the address must be the address 12 of that facility or relative. 13

SECTION 8. Section 86.004(b), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) For the general election for state and county officers, 16 17 the balloting materials for a voter who indicates on the application for a ballot to be voted by mail or the federal postcard 18 application that the voter seeks [is eligible] to vote early by mail 19 as a consequence of the voter's being outside the United States 20 shall be mailed on or before the later of the 45th day before 21 election day or the seventh calendar day after the date the clerk 22 receives the application. However, if it is not possible to mail 23 24 the ballots by the deadline of the 45th day before election day, the clerk shall notify the secretary of state within 24 hours of knowing 25 that the deadline will not be met. The secretary of state shall 26 monitor the situation and advise the clerk, who shall mail the 27

H.B. No. 942 1 ballots as soon as possible in accordance with the secretary of 2 state's guidelines. 3 SECTION 9. Section 87.041(b), Election Code, is amended to 4 read as follows: 5 (b) A ballot may be accepted only if: 6 (1) the carrier envelope certificate is properly 7 executed; 8 (2) neither the voter's signature on the ballot 9 application nor the signature on the carrier envelope certificate is determined to have been executed by a person other than the 10 voter, unless signed by a witness; 11 [the voter's ballot application states a legal 12 (3) ground for early voting by mail; 13 14 [(4)] the voter is registered to vote, if registration 15 is required by law; (4) [(5) the address to which the ballot was mailed to 16 17 the voter, as indicated by the application, was outside the voter's county of residence, if the ground for early voting is absence from 18 the county of residence; 19 $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$ for a voter to whom a statement of residence form 20 21 was required to be sent under Section 86.002(a), the statement of residence is returned in the carrier envelope and indicates that 22 the voter satisfies the residence requirements prescribed by 23 24 Section 63.0011; and 25 (5) $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ the address to which the ballot was mailed 26 to the voter is an address [that is otherwise] required by Sections 84.002 and 86.003. 27

SECTION 10. Section 102.001(a), Election Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 A qualified voter is eligible to vote a late ballot as (a) 4 provided by this chapter if the voter has a sickness or physical condition [described by Section 82.002] that prevents the voter 5 6 from appearing at the polling place on election day without a likelihood of needing personal assistance or of injuring the 7 8 voter's health and originates on or after the day before the last day for submitting an application for a ballot to be voted by mail. 9 SECTION 11. Sections 82.001 through 82.004, 84.002(b), and 10

11 112.002(b), Election Code, are repealed.

SECTION 12. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an election ordered on or after September 1, 2007.
