- 7 Session, 1997, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Section 46.02 does not apply to a person who:
- 9 (1) is in the actual discharge of official duties as a

- 13 (2) is on the person's own premises or premises under

- the owner of the premises and the person's primary responsibility
- is to act in the capacity of a security guard to protect persons or

- 19 (3) is traveling;
- 20 (4) is engaging in lawful hunting, fishing, or other

- 23 residence, if the weapon is a type commonly used in the activity;
- 24 (5) holds a security officer commission issued by the

- 12 handgun of the same category as the handgun the person is carrying;
- 13 (7) holds a security officer commission and a personal
- 14 protection $\underline{\text{officer}}$ authorization issued by the Texas [Board of
- 15 Private Investigators and Private Security Board [Agencies] and
- 16 [who] is providing personal protection under Chapter 1702,
- 17 Occupations Code [the Private Investigators and Private Security
- 18 Agencies Act (Article 4413(29bb), Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes)];
- 19 [or]
- 20 (8) holds an alcoholic beverage permit or license or
- 21 is an employee of a holder of an alcoholic beverage permit or
- 22 license if the person is supervising the operation of the permitted
- 23 or licensed premises; or
- 24 (9) is a student in a law enforcement class engaging in
- 25 an activity required as part of the class, if the weapon is a type
- 26 commonly used in the activity and the person is:
- 27 (A) on the immediate premises where the activity

- 2 (B) en route between those premises and the
- 3 person's residence and is carrying the weapon unloaded.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and
- 8 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 9 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 11 committed before that date.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
