## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to intensive preparation academies to prepare public
3	school students to take a state exit-level assessment instrument.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 39.0252 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 39.0252. EXIT-LEVEL ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENT INTENSIVE
8	PREPARATION ACADEMIES. (a) At the end of a school year in which
9	5% or more students in a school district fail to perform
10	satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified by Section
11	39.025(a), the districts selected according to Subsection d shall
12	operate at least one intensive preparation academy to prepare those
13	students to retake the assessment instrument.
14	(b) An intensive preparation academy must:
15	(1) be operated for at least 30 school days;
16	(2) include instruction in the curriculum material
17	most likely to be included in the assessment instruments specified
18	by Section 39.025(a); and
19	(3) include instruction in strategies for performing
20	satisfactorily on the assessment instruments.
21	(c) A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an
22	assessment instrument specified by Section 39.025(a) shall attend
23	each portion of an intensive preparation academy under this section
2/1	relating to that assessment instrument or to strategies described

- 2 (d) Subsection (a) applies beginning with assessment
- 3 instruments administered during the 2008-2009 school year. For the
- 4 2007-2008 school year, the commissioner shall select at least 10
- 5 and not more than 25 school districts in which 5% or more students
- 6 failed to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument
- 7 specified by Section 39.025(a) and administered during that school
- 8 year to operate intensive preparation academies for those students.
- 9 The commissioner shall select a group of districts that is diverse
- 10 <u>in terms of:</u>
- 11 (1) the number of students enrolled in each district;
- 12 (2) the race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status of
- 13 students in each district;
- 14 (3) the districts' characterization as urban,
- 15 suburban, or rural; and
- 16 (4) the districts' location in different geographic
- 17 regions of the state.
- 18 (e) Not later than December 15, 2008, the agency shall
- 19 deliver a written report to the legislature that reviews the
- 20 effectiveness of the intensive preparation academies operated
- 21 under Subsection (d). Subsection (d) and this subsection expire
- 22 January 15, 2009.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
