- 2 relating to licensing and regulation of cosmetology.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1602.256, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1602.256. ELIGIBILITY FOR A MANICURIST SPECIALTY
- 7 LICENSE. (a) A person holding a manicurist specialty license may
- 8 perform only the practice of cosmetology defined in Section
- 9 1602.002(a)(10) or $(11) [\frac{1602.002(9)}{a}]$ or (10)].
- 10 (b) To be eligible for a manicurist <u>specialty</u> license, an
- applicant must:
- 12 (1) be at least 17 years of age;
- 13 (2) have obtained a high school diploma or the
- 14 equivalent of a high school diploma or have passed a valid
- 15 examination administered by a certified testing agency that
- 16 measures the person's ability to benefit from training; and
- 17 (3) have completed 600 hours of instruction in
- 18 manicuring through a commission-approved training program.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 1602.257(a), Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) A person holding a facialist specialty license may
- 22 perform only the practice of cosmetology defined in Section
- 23 $1602.002(a)(6)-(9)[\frac{1602.002(7)}{1}].$
- SECTION 3. Section 1602.258, Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1602.258. ELIGIBILITY FOR A SPECIALTY
- 3 CERTIFICATE. (a) A person holding a specialty certificate may
- 4 perform only the practice of cosmetology defined in Section
- 5 $1602.002(a)(2)-(4)[\frac{1602.002(2)}{(3)}, \frac{(3)}{(4)}, \frac{(7)}{(7)}].$
- 6 (b) To be eligible for a specialty certificate, an applicant
- 7 must:
- 8 (1) be at least 17 years of age; and
- 9 (2) [have obtained a high school diploma or the
- 10 equivalent of a high school diploma or have passed a valid
- 11 examination administered by a certified testing agency that
- 12 measures the person's ability to benefit from training; and
- 13 $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$ have the necessary requisites as determined by
- 14 the department in the particular specialty for which certification
- 15 is sought, including training through a commission-approved
- 16 training program.
- SECTION 4. Section 1602.262(a), Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) An applicant for an operator license, instructor
- 20 license, <u>hairdresser specialty license</u>, manicurist <u>specialty</u>
- 21 license, or facialist specialty license is entitled to the license
- 22 if the applicant:
- 23 (1) meets the applicable eligibility requirements;
- 24 (2) passes the applicable examination;
- 25 (3) pays the required fee; and
- 26 (4) has not committed an act that constitutes a ground
- 27 for denial of the license.

- 1 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1602, Occupations Code, is
- 2 amended by adding Section 1602.268 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1602.268. ELIGIBILITY FOR A HAIRDRESSER SPECIALTY
- 4 LICENSE. (a) A person holding a hairdresser specialty license may
- 5 perform only the practice of cosmetology defined in Sections
- 6 1602.002(a)(1)-(5).
- 7 <u>(b) To be eligible for a hairdresser specialty license, an</u>
- 8 applicant must:
- 9 (1) be at least 17 years of age;
- 10 (2) have obtained a high school diploma or the
- 11 equivalent of a high school diploma or have passed a valid
- 12 examination administered by a certified testing agency that
- measures the person's ability to benefit from training; and
- 14 (3) either:
- 15 (A) have completed 850 hours of instruction in
- 16 <u>hairdressing through a commission-approved training program and</u>
- 17 passed the applicable examinations; or
- 18 (B) hold a current operator license.
- 19 SECTION 6. Section 1602.354, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1602.354. CONTINUING EDUCATION. (a) The commission
- 22 will by rule recognize, prepare, or administer continuing education
- 23 programs for the practice of cosmetology. Participation in the
- 24 programs is mandatory for all license renewals.
- 25 (b) The commission may only require a license holder to
- 26 complete continuing education of not more than four hours in health
- 27 and safety courses if the license holder:

- 1 (1) is at least 65 years of age; and
- 2 (2) has held a cosmetology license for at least 15
- 3 years.
- 4 SECTION 7. Section 1602.403(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A private beauty culture school may not employ:
- 7 (1) a person holding an operator license, manicurist
- 8 specialty license, or specialty certificate solely to perform the
- 9 practices of cosmetology for which the person is licensed or
- 10 certified; or
- 11 (2) a person holding an instructor license to perform
- 12 any act or practice of cosmetology.
- SECTION 8. Section 1602.266(c), Occupations Code, is
- 14 repealed.
- 15 SECTION 9. Not later than January 1, 2008, the Texas
- 16 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary
- 17 to implement the changes in law made by this Act, including rules to
- 18 administer:
- 19 (1) Section 1602.268, Occupations Code, as added by
- 20 this Act, related to curriculum, examination, and procedures for
- 21 issuance of a hairdresser specialty license; and
- 22 (2) Section 1602.354, Occupations Code, as amended by
- this Act, related to continuing education and renewal requirements.
- SECTION 10. (a) Section 1602.354, Occupations Code, as
- amended by this Act, applies only to a license that is renewed on or
- 26 after the effective date of this Act.
- (b) Section 1602.268, Occupations Code, as added by this

- 1 Act, takes effect January 1, 2008.
- 2 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 3 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 4 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 5 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 6 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
