5	SECTION 1. Section 552.132, Government Code, is amended to

7	Sec. 552.132. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY OF</u> [EXCEPTION:] CRIME VICTIM
8	OR CLAIMANT INFORMATION. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d)
9	[(f)], in this section, "crime victim <u>or claimant</u> " means a victim <u>or</u>
10	claimant under Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal
11	Procedure, who has filed an application for compensation under that
12	subchapter.
13	(b) The following [A crime victim may elect whether to allow
14	public access to] information held by the crime victim's
15	compensation division of the attorney general's office <u>is</u>
16	<pre>confidential [that relates to]:</pre>
17	(1) the name, social security number, address, or
18	telephone number of <u>a</u> [the] crime victim <u>or claimant</u> ; or
19	(2) any other information the disclosure of which
20	would identify or tend to identify the crime victim or claimant.
21	(c) [An election under Subsection (b) must be:
22	[(1) made in writing on a form developed by the
23	attorney general for that purpose and signed by the crime victim;

1 [(2) filed with the crime victims' compensation 2 division before the third anniversary of the date that the crime 3 victim filed the application for compensation.

4 [(d) If the crime victim elects not to allow public access 5 to the information, the information is excepted from the 6 requirements of Section 552.021. If the crime victim does not make 7 an election under Subsection (b) or (f) or elects to allow public 8 access to the information, the information is not excepted from the 9 requirements of Section 552.021 unless the information is made 10 confidential or excepted from those requirements by another law.

crime victim or claimant 11 [(e)] If the is awarded compensation under Section 56.34, Code of Criminal Procedure, as of 12 the date of the award of compensation, the name of the crime victim 13 or claimant and the amount of compensation awarded to that crime 14 15 victim or claimant are public information and are not excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021. 16

(d) [(f)] An employee of a governmental body who is also a 17 [crime] victim under Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal 18 Procedure, regardless of whether the employee has filed an 19 application for compensation under that subchapter, may elect 20 whether to allow public access to information held by the attorney 21 general's office or other governmental body that would identify or 22 tend to identify the [crime] victim, including a photograph or 23 24 other visual representation of the victim. An election under this subsection must be made in writing on a form developed by the 25 governmental body, be signed by the employee, and be filed with the 26 governmental body before the third anniversary of the latest to 27

2	(1) the date the crime was committed;
3	(2) the date employment begins; or
4	(3) the date the governmental body develops the form
5	and provides it to employees.
6	<u>(e)</u> If the employee fails to make an election <u>under</u>
7	Subsection (d), the identifying information is excepted from
8	disclosure until the third anniversary of the date the crime was
9	committed. In case of disability, impairment, or other incapacity
10	of the employee, the election may be made by the guardian of the
11	employee or former employee.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
