## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an immunization awareness program in certain school
- 3 districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Emily Lastinger Act.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 38.001, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (b), (d), and (e) and adding Subsection (b-1)
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (b) Subject to Subsection (c), the Department of State
- 10 [Texas Board of] Health Services may modify or delete any of the
- 11 immunizations in Subsection (a) or may require immunizations
- 12 against additional diseases as a requirement for admission to any
- 13 elementary or secondary school.
- 14 (b-1) Each year, the Department of State Health Services
- 15 shall prepare a list of the immunizations required under this
- 16 section for admission to public schools and of any additional
- immunizations the department recommends for school-age children.
- 18 The department shall prepare the list in English and Spanish and
- 19 make the list available in a manner that permits a school district
- 20 to easily post the list on the district's Internet website as
- 21 required by Section 38.019.
- 22 (d) The [Texas] Department of State Health Services shall
- 23 provide the required immunization to children in areas where no
- local provision exists to provide those services.

- 1 (e) A person may be provisionally admitted to an elementary
- 2 or secondary school if the person has begun the required
- 3 immunizations and if the person continues to receive the necessary
- 4 immunizations as rapidly as is medically feasible. The [Texas]
- 5 Department of State Health Services shall adopt rules relating to
- 6 the provisional admission of persons to an elementary or secondary
- 7 school.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 38.019 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 38.019. IMMUNIZATION AWARENESS PROGRAM. (a) A school
- 11 district that maintains an Internet website shall post prominently
- 12 <u>on the website:</u>
- 13 (1) a list, in English and Spanish, of:
- 14 (A) the immunizations required for admission to
- 15 public school by rules of the Department of State Health Services
- 16 adopted under Section 38.001;
- 17 (B) any immunizations or vaccines recommended
- 18 for public school students by the Department of State Health
- 19 Services; and
- 20 (C) health clinics in the district that offer the
- 21 <u>influenza vaccine</u>, to the extent those clinics are known to the
- 22 district; and
- 23 (2) a link to the Department of State Health Services
- 24 Internet website where a person may obtain information relating to
- 25 the procedures for claiming an exemption from the immunization
- 26 requirements of Section 38.001.
- 27 (a-1) The link to the Department of State Health Services

- 1 Internet website provided under Subsection (a)(2) must be presented
- 2 in the same manner as the information provided under Subsection
- 3 (a)(1).
- 4 (b) The list of recommended immunizations or vaccines under
- 5 Subsection (a)(2) must include the influenza vaccine, unless the
- 6 Department of State Health Services requires the influenza vaccine
- 7 for admission to public school.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 38.019, Education Code, as added by this
- 9 Act, applies beginning with the 2007-2008 school year.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
