- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.126, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (i) and (j) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (d), (e), [and] (g),
- 10 (i), and (j), a person commits an offense if the person:
- 11 (1) accesses or uses electronically readable
- 12 information derived from a driver's license, commercial driver's
- 13 license, or personal identification certificate; or
- 14 (2) compiles or maintains a database of electronically
- 15 readable information derived from driver's licenses, commercial
- 16 driver's licenses, or personal identification certificates.
- 17 (i) The prohibition provided by Subsection (b) does not
- 18 apply to a health care provider or hospital that accesses, uses,
- 19 compiles, or maintains a database of the information to provide
- 20 <u>health care services to the individual who holds the driver's</u>
- 21 license, commercial driver's license, or personal identification
- 22 <u>certificate. In this subsection, "health care provider" means an</u>
- 23 <u>individual</u> or facility licensed, certified, or otherwise
- 24 authorized by the law of this state to provide or administer health

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- 1 care, for profit or otherwise, in the ordinary course of business or
- 2 professional practice, including a physician, nurse, dentist,
- 3 podiatrist, pharmacist, chiropractor, therapeutic optometrist,
- 4 <u>ambulatory surgical center</u>, and nursing home.
- (j) A health care provider who obtains information 5 6 described by Subsection (i) may transfer the information to a 7 health care vendor, regional health care information organization, 8 or other person with whom the health care provider has entered into a business associate contract in accordance with the rules 9 implementing the federal Health Insurance Portability and 10 Accountability Act of 1996 (Pub. L. No. 104-191). The business 11 12 associate may use the information or compile or maintain a database of the information to assist the health care provider in providing 13 14 health care services to the individual who is the subject of the

information or in performing functions related to those health care
