BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 42.055(b), Penal Code, is amended to

SECTION 1. 1-20 read as follows:

(b) A person commits an offense if, during the period beginning one hour before the service begins and ending one hour 1-21 1-22 after the service is completed, the person engages in picketing within 1,000 [500] feet of a facility or cemetery being used for a 1-23 1-24 1-25 funeral service.

1-26 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 1-27 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 1-28 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 1-29 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
