- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 38.001, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (b) Subject to <u>Subsections (b-1) and [Subsection]</u> (c), the
- 8 <u>executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission</u>
- 9 [Texas Board of Health] may modify or delete any of the
- 10 immunizations in Subsection (a) or may require immunizations
- 11 against additional diseases as a requirement for admission to any
- 12 elementary or secondary school.
- 13 (b-1) Immunization against human papillomavirus is not
- 14 required for a person's admission to any elementary or secondary
- 15 school; however, educational material about the human
- 16 papillomavirus vaccine that is unbiased, medically and
- scientifically accurate, and peer reviewed shall be distributed to
- 18 each parent or legal guardian at the appropriate time in the
- 19 immunization schedule by the appropriate school. This subsection
- 20 preempts any contrary executive order issued by the governor.
