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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the issuance of bonds for recreational facilities by 3 certain conservation and reclamation districts in Montgomery 4 County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 49.4645, Water Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (f) to read as 8 follows:

A district all or part of which is located in Bastrop 9 (a) County, Bexar County, Waller County, Travis County, Williamson 10 11 County, Harris County, Galveston County, Brazoria County, Montgomery County, or Fort Bend County may issue bonds supported by 12 ad valorem taxes to pay for the development and maintenance of 13 14 recreational facilities only if the bonds are authorized by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the district voting in an 15 election held for that purpose. The outstanding principal amount 16 of bonds, notes, and other obligations issued to finance parks and 17 18 recreational facilities payable from any source may not exceed an amount equal to one percent of the value of the taxable property in 19 the district as shown by the tax rolls of the central appraisal 20 21 district at the time of the issuance of the bonds, notes, and other obligations or an amount greater than the estimated cost provided 22 in the park plan under Subsection (b), whichever is smaller. The 23 district may not issue bonds supported by ad valorem taxes to pay 24

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for the development and maintenance of:

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(1)indoor or outdoor swimming pools; or

(2) golf courses.

This section does not apply to a district all or part of 4 (f) 5 which:

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(1) is located in Montgomery County; and

(2) includes land within a planned community of at least 15,000 acres of land, of which a majority of the developed 8 9 acreage is subject to restrictive covenants containing ad valorem 10 assessments.

SECTION 2. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, if 11 the qualified voters of a district to which Chapter 49, Water Code, 12 applies and all or part of which is located in Montgomery County 13 authorized bonds supported by ad valorem taxes to pay for the 14 15 development and maintenance of recreational facilities by the favorable vote of a majority voting in an election held for that 16 17 purpose after September 13, 2003, but before the effective date of this Act, that bond authorization is valid and no further election 18 is required to authorize those bonds. 19

This section does not apply to a district described by 20 (b) 21 Section 49.4645(f), Water Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
