- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 471.007(a), (b), and (c),
- 6 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A railway company commits an offense if a train of the
- 8 railway company obstructs for more than $\underline{\text{five}}$ [10] minutes a street,
- 9 railroad crossing, or public highway.
- 10 (b) An offense under this section is a misdemeanor
- 11 punishable by a fine of $\underline{:}$
- 12 (1) \$1,000 if the obstruction lasts 10 minutes or
- 13 <u>less; and</u>
- 14 (2) an additional \$1,000 for each five minute interval
- 15 that the obstruction continues beyond 10 minutes [not less than
- 16 \$100 or more than \$300].
- 17 (c) An officer charging a railway company for an offense
- 18 under this section shall prepare in duplicate a citation to appear
- in court and attach one copy of the citation to the train or deliver
- 20 the copy to an employee or other agent of the railway company. The
- 21 citation must show:
- 22 (1) the name of the railway company;
- 23 (2) the offense charged; [and]
- 24 (3) the duration of the obstruction; and

- 1 $\underline{(4)}$ [$\overline{(3)}$] the time and place that a representative of the railway company is to appear in court.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 4 only to an offense committed on or after September 1, 2007.
- 5 (b) An offense committed before September 1, 2007, is
- 6 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
- 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 8 this section, an offense was committed before September 1, 2007, if
- 9 any element of the offense was committed before that date.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
