A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to mutual assistance agreements entered into by certain
3	municipalities and private institutions of higher education for the
4	purpose of enforcing state law and to additional powers,
5	privileges, and immunities of peace officers employed by private
6	institutions of higher education.

- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 51.212, Education Code, is amended to 9 read as follows:
- Sec. 51.212. <u>PEACE</u> [<u>SECURITY</u>] OFFICERS AT PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS. (a) The governing boards of private institutions of higher education, including private junior colleges, are authorized to employ and commission <u>officers</u> [<u>campus security</u>] to the purpose of enforcing the law of this state:
- on the campuses of private institutions of higher education; and
- 17 (2) at other locations, as permitted by Subsection (b)
 18 or Section 51.2125.
- 19 <u>(b)</u> Any officer commissioned under the provisions of this 20 section is vested with all the powers, privileges, and immunities 21 of peace officers <u>if the officer:</u>
- (1) is [while] on the property under the control and jurisdiction of the respective private institution of higher education or is otherwise performing [in the performance of his

- 1 assigned] duties assigned to the officer by the institution,
- 2 regardless of whether the officer is on property under the control
- 3 and jurisdiction of the institution; or
- 4 (2) to the extent authorized by Section 51.2125, is:
- 5 (A) requested by another law enforcement agency
- 6 to provide assistance in enforcing the law of this state and is
- 7 acting in response to that request; or
- 8 <u>(B) otherwise assisting another law enforcement</u>
- 9 agency in enforcing the law of this state.
- 10 <u>(c)</u> Any officer assigned to duty and commissioned shall take
- and file the oath required of peace officers, and shall execute and
- 12 file a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$1,000, payable to the
- 13 governor, with two or more good and sufficient sureties,
- 14 conditioned that the officer [he] will fairly, impartially, and
- 15 faithfully perform the duties as may be required of the officer
- 16 [him] by law. The bond may be sued on from time to time in the name
- of the person injured until the whole amount is recovered.
- (d) [(b)] The governing boards of private institutions of
- 19 higher education are authorized to hire and pay on a regular basis
- 20 peace [law-enforcement] officers commissioned by an incorporated
- 21 city. The officers shall be under the supervision of the hiring
- 22 institution, but shall be subject to dismissal and disciplinary
- 23 action by the city. An incorporated city is authorized to contract
- 24 with a private institution of higher education for the use and
- 25 employment of its commissioned officers in any manner agreed to,
- 26 provided that there is no expense incurred by the city.
- (e) [(c)] In this section, "private institution of higher

- 1 education" means a private or independent institution of higher
- 2 education as defined [has the meaning assigned] by Section 61.003
- $3 \quad [61.003(15) \text{ of this code}].$
- 4 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 51.2125 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 51.2125. PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS: AUTHORITY TO ENTER
- 7 INTO MUTUAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT. (a) This section applies only to
- 8 <u>a private institution of higher education</u>, as defined by Section
- 9 61.003, with an undergraduate enrollment of more than 5,000
- 10 <u>full-time equivalent stude</u>nts.
- 11 (b) If the institution has under its control and
- 12 jurisdiction property that is contiguous to, or located in any part
- 13 within the boundaries of, a municipality with a population of more
- 14 than one million, in addition to exercising the authority provided
- 15 under Section 51.212(d), the governing board of a private
- 16 <u>institution of higher education to which this section applies and</u>
- 17 the governing body of each municipality that is contiguous to, or
- 18 the boundaries of which contain any part of, property under the
- 19 control and jurisdiction of the private institution of higher
- 20 education may enter into a written mutual assistance agreement in
- 21 which peace officers commissioned by the institution or the
- 22 applicable municipality serve the public interest by assisting,
- 23 without any form of additional compensation or other financial
- 24 benefit, the peace officers of the other party to the agreement in
- 25 <u>enforcing the laws of this state. The agreement must be reviewed at</u>
- least annually by the institution and the municipality and may be
- 27 modified at that time by a written agreement signed by each party.

- 1 The agreement may be terminated at any time by a party to the
- 2 agreement on the provision of reasonable notice to the other party
- 3 to the agreement.
- 4 <u>(c) A mutual assistance agreement authorized by this</u>
- 5 section may designate the geographic area in which the campus peace
- 6 officers are authorized to provide assistance to the peace officers
- 7 <u>of the municipality.</u>
- 8 <u>(d) This section does not affect a municipality's duty to</u>
- 9 provide law enforcement services to any location within the
- 10 boundaries of the municipality.
- 11 (e) A peace officer providing assistance under a mutual
- 12 assistance agreement authorized by this section may make arrests
- 13 and exercise all other authority given to peace officers under
- 14 other state law. The municipal law enforcement agency has
- 15 exclusive authority to supervise any campus peace officer operating
- 16 under the agreement to assist the peace officers of the
- 17 municipality. A municipal peace officer operating under the
- 18 agreement to assist the campus peace officers remains under the
- 19 supervision of the municipal law enforcement agency.
- 20 (f) In the same manner and to the same extent as a
- 21 municipality is liable for an act or omission of a peace officer
- 22 employed by the municipality, a private institution of higher
- 23 <u>education is liable for an act or omission of a campus peace officer</u>
- 24 operating under a mutual assistance agreement authorized by this
- 25 section at a location other than property under the control and
- 26 jurisdiction of the institution.
- 27 (g) This section does not limit the authority of a campus

- 1 peace officer to make a warrantless arrest outside the officer's
- 2 jurisdiction as described by Article 14.03(d), Code of Criminal
- 3 <u>Procedure.</u>
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
