AN ACT

Regulation to issue certain enforcement orders in the regulation of

- 2 relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Licensing and
- 4 barbering and cosmetology.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 1603, Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Sections 1603.455 and 1603.456 to read as
- 8 follows:

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- 9 Sec. 1603.455. EMERGENCY ORDERS. (a) The executive
- director may issue an emergency order to suspend or revoke a license
- or permit issued, or to cease the operation of an unsafe facility
- 12 regulated, by the department under this title if the executive
- 13 <u>director determines that an emergency exists requiring immediate</u>
- 14 action to protect the public health and safety.
- 15 (b) The executive director may issue the emergency order
- 16 with or without notice and hearing as the executive director
- 17 considers practicable under the circumstances.
- 18 (c) If an emergency order is issued under this section
- 19 without a hearing, the executive director, not later than the 10th
- 20 day after the date the emergency order was issued, shall set the
- 21 time and place for a hearing conducted by the State Office of
- 22 Administrative Hearings to affirm, modify, or set aside the
- 23 emergency order. The executive director shall set the hearing for a
- 24 date not later than the 30th day after the date the time and place

- 1 for the hearing are set. The hearing examiner shall affirm the
- 2 order to the extent that reasonable cause existed to issue the
- 3 <u>order.</u>
- 4 (d) The commission by rule may prescribe procedures for the
- 5 issuance and appeal of an emergency order under this section,
- 6 including a rule to allow the commission to affirm, modify, or set
- 7 <u>aside a decision by the State Office of Administrative Hearings</u>
- 8 under Subsection (c).
- 9 (e) A proceeding under this section is a contested case
- 10 <u>under Chapter 2001, Government Code.</u>
- Sec. 1603.456. CEASE AND DESIST ORDERS. The executive
- 12 director may issue a cease and desist order, after notice and
- opportunity for hearing, if the executive director determines that
- 14 the order is necessary to prevent a violation of:
- (1) this chapter, Chapter 1601, or Chapter 1602; or
- 16 (2) a rule adopted by the commission.
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
