## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the regulation of funeral homes, cemeteries, and
- 3 crematories.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 711.004, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:
- 7 (m) If a removal of remains is made to correct an error by a
- 8 cemetery organization, the cemetery organization is responsible
- 9 for all costs involved in the removal and reinterment of the
- 10 <u>remains.</u>
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 711.012(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The Texas Funeral Service Commission may adopt rules,
- 14 establish procedures, and prescribe forms to enforce and administer
- 15 Sections 711.003, 711.008, 711.010, 711.011, 711.021-711.035,
- 16 711.038, 711.0395, 711.041, 711.042, 711.061, and 711.062 relating
- 17 to cemeteries that are not perpetual care cemeteries.
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 711.038, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 20 <u>(f) A cemetery organization may not resell the exclusive</u>
- 21 right of sepulture in a plot unless the exclusive right of sepulture
- 22 has been reacquired by the cemetery organization. A sanction or
- 23 other penalty may not be imposed on a cemetery organization that
- 24 violates this subsection unless:

- 1 (1) the state agency authorized to enforce this
- 2 section provides the cemetery organization written notice of the
- 3 violation; and
- 4 (2) the cemetery organization does not correct the
- 5 violation before the 91st day after the date on which the cemetery
- 6 organization received the notice.
- 7 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 711, Health and Safety
- 8 Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0395 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 711.0395. MULTIPLE INTERMENTS IN SAME PLOT. A
- 10 cemetery organization may not make more than one interment in a plot
- 11 unless each owner of the plot consents to the interment.
- 12 SECTION 5. Subchapter A, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 13 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.0035 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 716.0035. ACCEPTANCE OF REMAINS. A crematory
- 15 establishment may accept deceased human remains for refrigeration
- 16 before it receives authorization to cremate the remains under
- 17 Subchapter B.
- 18 SECTION 6. Section 716.051, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 Sec. 716.051. CREMATION AUTHORIZATION. Except as
- 21 [otherwise] provided by Section 716.054 [in this chapter], a
- 22 crematory establishment may not cremate deceased human remains
- 23 until it receives:
- 24 (1) a cremation authorization form signed by:
- 25 (A) an authorizing agent; and
- 26 (B) a funeral director of the funeral
- 27 establishment that contracted to provide for the cremation; and

- 1 (2) a death certificate or other death record that
- 2 indicates the deceased human remains may be cremated.
- 3 SECTION 7. Sections 716.052(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) A cremation authorization form must:
- 6 (1) identify the deceased person and the time and date
- 7 of death;
- 8 (2) include the name and address of the funeral
- 9 establishment [director or other person] that contracted to provide
- 10 for the cremation;
- 11 (3) identify the authorizing agent and the
- 12 relationship between the authorizing agent and the deceased person;
- 13 (4) include a statement by the authorizing agent that:
- 14 (A) the authorizing agent has the right to
- 15 authorize the cremation of the deceased person and is not aware of
- any person with a superior or equal priority right; or
- 17 (B) if another person has an equal priority right
- 18 to authorize cremation, the authorizing agent:
- 19 (i) has made all reasonable efforts but
- 20 failed to contact that person and believes the person would not
- 21 object to the cremation; and
- 22 (ii) agrees to indemnify and hold harmless
- 23 the funeral establishment and the crematory establishment for any
- 24 liability arising from performing the cremation without the
- 25 person's authorization;
- 26 (5) authorize the crematory establishment to cremate
- 27 the human remains;

- 1 (6) declare that to their knowledge the human remains
- 2 do not contain a pacemaker or any other material or implant that may
- 3 potentially be hazardous or cause damage to the cremation chamber
- 4 or the person performing the cremation;
- 5 (7) include the name of the funeral establishment or
- 6 other person authorized to receive the cremated remains from the
- 7 crematory establishment;
- 8 (8) detail the manner of permanent disposition of the
- 9 cremated remains, if known;
- 10 (9) list any items of value delivered to the crematory
- 11 establishment along with the human remains and include instructions
- 12 on the handling of the items;
- 13 (10) specify whether the authorizing agent has
- 14 arranged for a viewing of the deceased person or service with the
- 15 deceased person present before cremation and the date and time of
- 16 the viewing or service; and
- 17 (11) include the signature of the authorizing agent
- 18 attesting to the accuracy of all representations contained on the
- 19 cremation authorization form.
- 20 (c) A funeral director [or other representative] of a
- 21 funeral establishment that contracts to provide for the cremation
- 22 of deceased human remains must sign the cremation authorization
- 23 form.
- SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 25 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.054 to read as follows:
- Sec. 716.054. EXCEPTION; WRITTEN DIRECTIONS. (a) This
- 27 section applies and a cremation authorization form is not required

- 1 under this chapter if:
- 2 (1) the deceased person has left written directions
- 3 for the disposition by cremation of the deceased person's human
- 4 remains as provided by Section 711.002(g); and
- 5 (2) the authorizing agent refuses for any reason to
- 6 sign a cremation authorization form.
- 7 <u>(b) The crematory establishment may cremate the deceased</u>
- 8 person's human remains without receipt of a cremation authorization
- 9 form signed by the authorizing agent if:
- 10 <u>(1) cremation costs are paid; and</u>
- 11 (2) the authorizing agent provides positive written
- identification that the human remains to be cremated are the human
- 13 remains of the deceased person.
- 14 (c) An authorizing agent shall notify the funeral director
- in writing of the presence of a pacemaker or other potentially
- 16 <u>hazardous implant in the human remains.</u> If the authorizing agent
- 17 fails to make this notification:
- 18 (1) the funeral director does not have a duty to ensure
- 19 that a pacemaker or other potentially hazardous implant is removed
- 20 from the human remains before delivering the remains to a crematory
- 21 <u>establishment; and</u>
- (2) the authorizing agent is liable to the crematory
- 23 <u>establishment in a civil action for any damages resulting from</u>
- 24 cremation of the remains containing the pacemaker or other
- 25 potentially hazardous implant.
- SECTION 9. Section 716.102(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 27 amended to read as follows:

- 1 (a) A crematory establishment shall furnish to a
- 2 representative of a funeral establishment who delivers deceased
- 3 human remains to the crematory establishment a receipt that
- 4 includes:
- 5 (1) the signature and printed name of the
- 6 representative who delivered the remains;
- 7 (2) the date and time of the delivery;
- 8 (3) the type of cremation container in which the
- 9 remains were delivered;
- 10 (4) the name of the funeral establishment [or other
- 11 entity] that contracted to provide for the cremation;
- 12 (5) the name of the individual who received the human
- 13 remains on behalf of the crematory; and
- 14 (6) the name of the deceased person.
- 15 SECTION 10. Section 716.103, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 716.103. IDENTIFICATION RESPONSIBILITY OF CREMATORY.
- 18 (a) A crematory establishment shall place on the exterior of a
- 19 cremation container a label with the deceased person's name as
- 20 provided by the authorizing agent unless the crematory
- 21 establishment knows the name is incorrect.
- (b) A crematory establishment shall place, with the
- 23 cremated remains, in the temporary container, urn, or other
- 24 permanent container, a permanent metal identification disc,
- 25 bracelet, or other item that can be used to identify the deceased
- 26 person.
- SECTION 11. Section 716.104(a), Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Except as provided by Section 716.054, a [A] funeral
- 3 director or funeral establishment shall provide a signed written
- 4 statement to a crematory establishment that the human remains
- 5 delivered to the crematory establishment were positively
- 6 identified as the deceased person listed on the cremation
- 7 authorization form by the authorizing agent or a representative of
- 8 the authorizing agent delegated as provided by Section 716.053.
- 9 SECTION 12. Section 716.152(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (d) To the extent practicable, the crematory establishment
- 12 shall remove all recoverable cremation residue from the cremation
- 13 chamber following cremation and pulverize any bone fragments to a
- 14 particle size of one-eighth inch or less as necessary. The
- 15 crematory establishment shall remove and dispose of any other
- 16 material included with the residue.
- SECTION 13. Sections 716.156(a) and (b), Health and Safety
- 18 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) A crematory establishment shall:
- 20 (1) release the cremated remains to a representative
- 21 of the funeral establishment that delivered the deceased human
- 22 remains to the crematory establishment;
- 23 (2) release the cremated remains to the person
- 24 authorized to receive the remains on the cremation authorization
- 25 form; [<del>or</del>]
- 26 (3) ship the remains to the shipping address provided
- 27 by the authorizing agent on the cremation authorization form not

- 1 later than the 30th day following the date of cremation; or
- 2 (4) release the cremated remains according to written
- 3 directions for the disposition by cremation of the deceased
- 4 person's human remains as provided by Section 711.002(g).
- 5 (b) A crematory establishment shall furnish to a person who
- 6 receives the cremated remains a receipt that includes:
- 7 (1) the date and time of release;
- 8 (2) the printed name of the person who receives the 9 cremated remains;
- 10 (3) the name of the funeral establishment that [or 11 other entity who] contracted to provide for the cremation;
- 12 (4) the printed name of the person who released the 13 cremated remains on behalf of the crematory establishment; and
- 14 (5) the name of the deceased person.
- SECTION 14. Subchapter E, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 16 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.204 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 716.204. IMMUNITY FROM CRIMINAL AND CIVIL LIABILITY;
- 18 WRITTEN DIRECTIONS. (a) In this section:
- 19 (1) "Cemetery organization" has the meaning assigned
- 20 by Section 711.001.
- 21 (2) "Embalmer" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 22 <u>651.001, Occupations Code.</u>
- (b) If Section 716.054(a) applies, a cemetery organization,
- 24 a business operating a crematory or columbarium, a funeral
- 25 director, an embalmer, or a funeral establishment is not criminally
- 26 liable or liable in a civil action for:
- 27 (1) cremating the human remains of a deceased person;

- 1 <u>or</u>
- 2 (2) carrying out the written directions of the
- 3 <u>deceased person.</u>
- 4 SECTION 15. Section 716.304, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 716.304. SCATTERING REMAINS. A person may scatter
- 7 cremated remains over uninhabited public land, over a public
- 8 waterway or sea, or on the private property of a consenting owner  $[\tau]$
- 9 if the remains are reduced to a particle size of one-eighth inch or
- 10 less.] Unless the container is biodegradable, the cremated remains
- 11 must be removed from the container before being scattered.
- 12 SECTION 16. Section 716.351(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 15 (1) cremates human remains without receipt of:
- 16 (A) a cremation authorization form signed by an
- 17 authorizing agent; or
- 18 (B) written directions for the disposition by
- 19 cremation of the deceased person's human remains as provided in
- 20 Section 711.002(g);
- 21 (2) signs a cremation authorization form with actual
- 22 knowledge that the form contains false or incorrect information; or
- 23 (3) represents to the public that the person may
- 24 cremate human remains without being licensed as provided by
- 25 Subchapter N, Chapter 651, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 17. Section 651.154(a), Occupations Code, is
- 27 amended to read as follows:

- 1 (a) The commission shall set the following fees in amounts
- 2 reasonable and necessary to administer this chapter:
- 3 (1) the funeral director's and embalmer's application
- 4 fee, license fee, duplicate license fee, and reciprocal license
- 5 fee; and
- 6 (2) the cemetery, crematory, or funeral establishment
- 7 license fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty.
- 8 SECTION 18. Section 651.156, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 10 (d) A subpoena or subpoena duces tecum issued under this
- 11 section is not effective unless it is issued in compliance with:
- 12 (1) state and federal law; and
- 13 (2) commission rules adopted under Subsection (c).
- SECTION 19. Section 651.165(d), Occupations Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (d) A person whose license has been expired for one year or
- more may [not] renew the license by:
- 18 (1) retaking and passing the applicable examination;
- 19 (2) paying any applicable fees, including a renewal
- 20 fee that is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee;
- 21 <u>and</u>
- 22 (3) completing any continuing education required
- 23 <u>under Section 651.266</u>. [The person may obtain a new license by
- 24 complying with the requirements and procedures, including the
- 25 examination requirements, for obtaining an original license.
- SECTION 20. Subchapter D, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 651.1655 to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 651.1655. REINSTATEMENT OF SUSPENDED LICENSE. A
- 2 person whose license has been suspended may renew the license by
- 3 paying to the commission a renewal fee that is equal to two times
- 4 the normally required renewal fee.
- 5 SECTION 21. The heading to Section 651.267, Occupations
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 651.267. REISSUANCE OF <u>REVOKED</u> LICENSE.
- 8 SECTION 22. Sections 651.267(a) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 9 are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) On application, the commission may reissue a license
- 11 issued under this subchapter to a person whose license has been
- 12 [suspended or] revoked. An application to reissue a license may not
- 13 be made before the third [first] anniversary of the date of the
- 14 [suspension or] revocation.
- 15 (d) A license that has been revoked [or suspended for a
- 16 period of five years or more] may be reinstated only after the
- 17 applicant:
- 18 (1) retakes and passes the applicable examination;
- 19 (2) pays a fee that is equal to two times the normally
- 20 required renewal fee; and
- 21 (3) satisfies any other commission requirements,
- 22 including any continuing education requirements under Section
- 23 651.266.
- SECTION 23. Section 651.304(e), Occupations Code, is
- amended to read as follows:
- 26 (e) The commission by rule shall prescribe reporting
- 27 requirements for provisional license holders. The commission shall

- 1 furnish report forms to be used by a provisional license holder.
- 2 SECTION 24. Sections 651.351(d) and (f), Occupations Code,
- 3 are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (d) A funeral establishment must:
- 5 (1) meet the building, fire safety, and health
- 6 standards and health ordinances of this state and of the
- 7 municipality in which the establishment is located;
- 8 (2) be located at a fixed place that is not tax-exempt
- 9 property or a cemetery;
- 10 (3) include facilities in which funeral services may
- 11 be conducted;
- 12 (4) have access to rolling stock consisting of at
- 13 least one motor hearse;
- 14 (5) include a preparation room containing the
- 15 facilities, equipment, and supplies required by commission rule to
- 16 ensure the provision of adequate embalming services;
- 17 (6) include other facilities as necessary to comply
- 18 with the sanitary codes of this state and of the municipality in
- 19 which the room is located; and
- 20 (7) include a display containing sufficient
- 21 merchandise to permit reasonable selection, including at least five
- 22 adult caskets, two of which must be full-size and displayed in a
- 23 <u>casket showroom</u>.
- 24 (f) The least expensive casket displayed under Subsection
- 25 (d)(7) must be a full-size casket displayed in the same general
- 26 manner as the other full-size caskets are displayed. The three
- 27 adult caskets that are not required to be full-size under

- 1 Subsection (d)(7) may be displayed:
- 2 (1) in a partial panel display; or
- 3 (2) by video or brochure, online, or in any other
- 4 manner.
- 5 SECTION 25. Section 651.353(d), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) This section does not apply to:
- 8 (1) a family, fraternal, or community cemetery that is
- 9 not larger than 10 acres;
- 10 (2) an unincorporated association of plot owners not
- 11 operated for profit;
- 12 (3) a church, a religious society or denomination, or
- 13 an entity solely administering the temporalities of a church or
- 14 religious society or denomination; [or]
- 15 (4) a public cemetery owned by this state, a county, or
- 16 a municipality; or
- 17 (5) a perpetual care cemetery.
- 18 SECTION 26. Sections 651.354(a), (c), and (d), Occupations
- 19 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The commission shall mail written notice to a cemetery
- 21 or funeral establishment of the impending expiration of the
- 22 establishment's license not later than the 30th day before the
- 23 expiration date of the license. The [Except as provided by
- 24 Subsection (d), the] notice must state that:
- 25 (1) to renew the license, the cemetery or funeral
- 26 establishment must pay the renewal fee not later than the license
- 27 expiration date [September 30]; and

- 1 (2) the license is automatically renewed on receipt of
- 2 the renewal fee.
- 3 (c) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the
- 4 cemetery or funeral establishment [may not renew the license and]
- 5 may not operate as a cemetery or funeral establishment until the
- 6 renewal fee and the late payment penalty are paid [establishment is
- 7 issued a new license in the manner provided for issuing an original
- 8 <del>license</del>].
- 9 (d) This section does not apply to [To renew a license for] a
- 10 perpetual care cemetery [, the cemetery must submit a renewal on a
- 11 form prescribed by the commission. The license is renewed on
- 12 receipt of the form by the commission].
- SECTION 27. Subchapter H, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 651.355 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 651.355. PERPETUAL CARE CEMETERY REGISTRATION. (a)
- 16 The Texas Department of Banking shall provide annually to the
- 17 commission a list of perpetual care cemeteries, including the
- 18 address and other contact information for each cemetery. The
- 19 commission shall annually register each perpetual care cemetery on
- 20 that list.
- 21 (b) A perpetual care cemetery is not required to pay a
- 22 registration fee or renewal fee under this chapter.
- SECTION 28. Subchapter J, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 651.461 to read as follows:
- Sec. 651.461. DEFENSE TO VIOLATION. A person licensed
- 26 under this chapter does not violate this chapter by engaging in
- 27 conduct regarding funeral arrangements under the direction of a

1 person who:

- 2 (1) represents to the license holder that the person
- 3 is authorized to make funeral arrangements for the deceased; and
- 4 (2) provides written directions to the license holder
- 5 in the manner provided by Section 711.002, Health and Safety Code.
- 6 SECTION 29. Section 651.507(a), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The commission or an administrative law judge employed
- 9 by the State Office of Administrative Hearings shall review each
- 10 disciplinary proceeding to determine whether the license holder has
- 11 previously violated [committed] the same provision of this chapter
- or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation on one or more
- 13 previous occasions]. If it is determined that the license holder
- 14 has previously violated [committed] the same provision of this
- chapter or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation], the
- 16 commission or administrative law judge shall impose a disciplinary
- 17 action that is more severe than that imposed on the previous
- 18 occasion.
- 19 SECTION 30. Section 651.658(d), Occupations Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (d) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the
- 22 <u>crematory establishment may not operate a crematory until the</u>
- 23 renewal fee and late payment penalty are paid [A person may not
- 24 renew a license that has been expired for more than 30 days. A
- 25 person holding a license that has been expired for more than 30 days
- 26 must apply for a new license as required by this subchapter to
- 27 conduct a crematory business].

- 1 SECTION 31. The following are repealed:
- 2 (1) Section 716.004(b), Health and Safety Code; and
- 3 (2) Sections 651.304(b) and (c), 651.651(3), and
- 4 651.656(d), Occupations Code.
- 5 SECTION 32. Section 711.004(m), Health and Safety Code, as
- 6 added by this Act, applies only to costs incurred as a result of an
- 7 error that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Costs
- 8 incurred as a result of an error that occurred before the effective
- 9 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the
- 10 error occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 11 purpose.
- 12 SECTION 33. Sections 651.165(d), 651.354, and 651.658(d),
- Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to a license
- 14 that expires on or after the effective date of this Act. A license
- 15 that expired before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 16 the law in effect at the time the license expired, and the former
- 17 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 34. Section 651.1655, Occupations Code, as added by
- 19 this Act, applies only to a license suspended on or after the
- 20 effective date of this Act. A license suspended before the
- 21 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the
- 22 time the license was suspended, and the former law is continued in
- 23 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 35. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended
- 25 by this Act, applies only to a license revoked on or after the
- 26 effective date of this Act. A license revoked before the effective
- 27 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the

- 1 license was revoked, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 2 that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 36. Not later than January 1, 2008, the Texas
- 4 Department of Banking shall provide the initial list of perpetual
- 5 care cemeteries to the Texas Funeral Service Commission as required
- 6 by Section 651.355, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 37. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
