A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the Legislative Blue Ribbon Panel on Aging Issues.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. BLUE RIBBON PANEL ESTABLISHED. The Blue Ribbon
- 5 Panel on Aging Issues is established to study issues relating to the
- 6 aging population of Texas and to address the needs of that
- 7 population.
- 8 SECTION 2. DEFINITION. In this Act, "panel" means the Blue
- 9 Ribbon Panel on Aging Issues.
- 10 SECTION 3. COMPOSITION OF PANEL. (a) The panel is composed
- 11 of:
- 12 (1) two members of the public appointed by the
- 13 governor;
- 14 (2) two members of the senate and one public member
- appointed by the lieutenant governor; and
- 16 (3) two members of the house of representatives and
- 17 one public member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 18 representatives.
- 19 (b) A member of the panel serves at the pleasure of the
- 20 appointing official.
- 21 (c) The panel shall elect a presiding officer from among the
- 22 members of the panel.
- 23 (d) A public member of the panel may be reimbursed for the
- 24 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of

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- 1 the panel at the rate established in the General Appropriations
- 2 Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. PANEL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The panel shall:
- 4 (1) meet at the call of the presiding officer;
- 5 (2) receive information about rules proposed or
- 6 adopted by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 7 Services Commission relating to the aging population;
- 8 (3) review specific recommendations for legislation
- 9 proposed by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 10 Services Commission, a health and human services agency described
- 11 by Section 531.001, Government Code, or the attorney general
- 12 relating to the aging population;
- 13 (4) monitor the effectiveness and efficacy of the
- 14 regulatory systems of this state relating to the aging population;
- 15 and
- 16 (5) request reports and other information from the
- 17 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission,
- a health and human services agency described by Section 531.001,
- 19 Government Code, and the attorney general relating to the aging
- 20 population.
- 21 (b) The panel shall use the existing staff resources of the
- 22 senate and the house of representatives to assist the panel in
- 23 performing its duties under this section.
- 24 SECTION 5. REPORT. (a) The panel shall submit a report
- 25 based on its findings to the 81st Legislature not later than
- 26 September 1, 2008.
- 27 (b) The report must include:

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- 1 (1) identification of significant problems in the
- 2 regulatory systems related to the aging population, with
- 3 recommendations for action;
- 4 (2) the effectiveness and efficiency of the regulatory
- 5 systems of this state related to the aging population, with
- 6 recommendations for any necessary research;
- 7 (3) an analysis of the types of services available to
- 8 the aging citizens of this state; and
- 9 (4) recommendations for legislative action.
- 10 SECTION 6. APPOINTMENT OF PANEL. The governor, the
- 11 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 12 representatives shall appoint members of the Blue Ribbon Panel on
- 13 Aging Issues, as created by this Act, not later than the 30th day
- 14 after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 18 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
