H.B. No. 1374

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to service areas of the Amarillo College District and the  
3 Borger Junior College District.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 130.164, Education Code, is amended to  
6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 130.164. AMARILLO COLLEGE DISTRICT SERVICE AREA. The  
8 service area of the Amarillo College District includes[+]

9 [~~(1)~~] the territory within Potter, Randall, Carson,  
10 Oldham, Deaf Smith, Parmer, Castro, [~~and~~] Swisher, and Moore  
11 counties[~~, and~~

12 [~~(2) the territory within Moore County that is within~~  
13 ~~the Dumas Independent School District]~~.

14 SECTION 2. Section 130.169, Education Code, is amended to  
15 read as follows:

16 Sec. 130.169. BORGER JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT SERVICE AREA.  
17 The service area of the Borger Junior College District includes:

18 (1) the territory within the Borger Independent School  
19 District;

20 (2) the territory within the Spring Creek Independent  
21 School District that is also within the junior college district's  
22 taxing district; and

23 (3) the territory within Dallam, Sherman, Hansford,  
24 Ochiltree, Lipscomb, Hartley, Hutchinson, Roberts, and Hemphill

1 counties[~~, and~~

2 [~~(4) the territory within Moore County, except the~~  
3 ~~territory within the Dumas Independent School District]~~.

4 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies  
5 beginning with the 2007 fall semester, except that during the  
6 2007-2008 academic year the Borger Junior College District may  
7 continue to treat the area removed by this Act from the district's  
8 service area as if the area were still in the district's service  
9 area as necessary to avoid an unreasonable interruption of junior  
10 college services in the area.

11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
15 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
