3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0107 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 161.0107. HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS; VACCINES EDUCATION
7	MATERIALS. (a) The department, using existing resources, shall
8	produce and distribute informational materials regarding vaccines
9	against human papillomavirus that are approved by the United States
10	Food and Drug Administration for human use. The materials must
11	include information relating to the effectiveness, availability,
12	and contraindications of the vaccines. The materials must be
13	available in English and in Spanish.
14	(b) The department shall collaborate with the Texas Cancer
15	<u>Council or its successor entity to develop educational programs for</u>
16	parents regarding human papillomavirus and promoting awareness of a
17	minor's need for preventive services for cervical cancer and its
18	precursors.
19	(c) The department shall develop and maintain an Internet
20	website that targets the public and health care professionals and
21	provides accurate, comprehensive information on all aspects of
22	cervical cancer prevention, including vaccination against human
23	papillomavirus.
24	SECTION 2. Chapter 163, Health and Safety Code, is amended

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1	by adding Section 163.003 to read as follows:
2	Sec. 163.003. ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONAL ELEMENTS REGARDING
3	HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS. Course materials and instruction relating to
4	sexually transmitted diseases must be available in English and in
5	Spanish and should include:
6	(1) the following specific information on human
7	papillomavirus:
8	(A) that sexual intercourse is not required to
9	become infected with human papillomavirus and that the avoidance of
10	skin-to-skin contact involving the genital areas offers the best
11	protection;
12	(B) that both males and females may be infected
13	with human papillomavirus and symptoms may not be present;
14	(C) that younger women are at greater risk of
15	human papillomavirus infection than older women; and
16	(D) that human papillomavirus may be transmitted
17	to an infant during childbirth;
18	(2) information regarding the role of human
19	papillomavirus in the development of genital warts, cervical
20	cancer, and other diseases; and
21	(3) information regarding the continuing need for
22	women to undergo Pap smear testing, even if they have received a
23	vaccination against human papillomavirus.
24	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
