4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 12, Health and Safety
6	Code, is transferred to Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code,
7	redesignated as Chapter 107A, Health and Safety Code, and amended
8	to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 107A [SUBCHAPTER G]. OFFICE FOR THE ELIMINATION OF HEALTH
10	DISPARITIES [OF MINORITY HEALTH]
11	Sec. <u>107A.001</u> [ <del>12.081</del> ]. OFFICE <u>FOR THE ELIMINATION OF</u>
12	HEALTH DISPARITIES [OF MINORITY HEALTH]. The executive
13	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
14	[ <del>department</del> ] shall [ <del>establish and</del> ] maintain an office <u>for the</u>
15	<u>elimination of health disparities</u> [ <del>of minority health</del> ] in the
16	Health and Human Services Commission [department] to:
17	(1) assume a leadership role in working or contracting
18	with state and federal agencies, universities, private interest
19	groups, communities, foundations, and offices of minority health to
20	develop [ <del>minority</del> ] health initiatives <u>to decrease or eliminate</u>
21	health and health access disparities among racial, multicultural,
22	disadvantaged, ethnic, and regional populations, including
23	appropriate language services [bilingual communications]; and
24	(2) maximize use of existing resources without

1 duplicating existing efforts.

Sec. <u>107A.002</u> [<del>12.082</del>]. POWERS OF OFFICE. The office may: (1) provide a central information and referral source, including a clearinghouse for health disparities information, and serve as the primary state resource in coordinating, planning, and advocating access to [minority] health care services <u>to eliminate</u> health disparities in this state;

8 (2) coordinate conferences and other training 9 opportunities to increase skills among state agencies and 10 government staff in management and in the appreciation of cultural 11 diversity;

12 (3) pursue and administer grant funds for innovative13 projects for communities, groups, and individuals;

14 (4) provide recommendations and training in improving 15 minority recruitment in state agencies;

16 (5) publicize <u>information regarding health</u> 17 <u>disparities and</u> minority health issues through the use of the 18 media;

19 (6) network with existing minority organizations,
 20 <u>community-based health groups, and statewide health coalitions;</u>

(7) solicit, receive, and spend grants, gifts, and
 donations from public and private sources; and

(8) contract with public and private entities in theperformance of its responsibilities.

25 Sec. <u>107A.003</u> [<del>12.083</del>]. FUNDING. The <u>Health and Human</u> 26 <u>Services Commission</u> [<del>department</del>] may distribute to the office 27 unobligated and unexpended appropriations to be used to carry out

2	[Sec. 12.084. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than
3	January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the office shall submit a
4	biennial report to the legislature regarding the activities of the
5	office and any findings and recommendations relating to minority
6	health issues.]
7	SECTION 2. Sections 107.001 through 107.004 and 107.008,
8	Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
9	Sec. 107.001. <u>DEFINITIONS</u> [ <del>DEFINITION</del> ]. In this chapter <u>:</u>
10	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
11	Commission.
12	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
13	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
14	(3) "Health and human services agency" means a health
15	and human services agency listed by Section 531.001, Government
16	Code.
17	(4) "Task[ <del>, "task</del> ] force" means the health disparities
18	task force established under this chapter.
19	Sec. 107.002. PURPOSE. The purpose of the task force is to
20	assist the <u>commission</u> [ <del>department</del> ] in accomplishing the following
21	goals:
22	(1) to eliminate health and health access disparities
23	in Texas among <u>racial,</u> multicultural, disadvantaged, <u>ethnic,</u> and
24	regional populations; and
25	(2) to structure health and human services agency
26	[ <del>reorganize department</del> ] programs to eliminate <u>health and health</u>
27	<u>access</u> [ <del>those</del> ] disparities.

Sec. 107.003. DUTIES. (a) The task force shall: 1 investigate and report on issues related to health 2 (1)and health access disparities among racial, multicultural, 3 4 disadvantaged, ethnic, and regional populations; 5 (2) develop short-term and long-term strategies to 6 eliminate health and health access disparities among racial, multicultural, disadvantaged, ethnic, and regional populations, 7 with a focus on structuring health and human services agency 8 9 [reorganizing department] programs to eliminate those disparities; (3) monitor the progress of each health and human 10 services agency [the department] in: 11 eliminating [the] health and health access 12 (A) disparities; and 13 14 (B) structuring the agency's program activities 15 [reorganizing department programs] to eliminate the disparities; 16 and 17 (4) advise each health and human services agency [the department] on the implementation of any targeted programs or 18 funding authorized by the legislature to address health and health 19 access disparities. 20 In performing the duties described in Subsection (a), 21 (b) the task force shall consult with each health and human services 22 agency [the department], the Office for the Elimination of Health 23 24 Disparities [of Minority Health and Cultural Competency, women's 25 health offices of the department], and any other relevant division 26 of the commission [the department]. Sec. 107.004. REPORT. The task force shall 27 submit а

biennial report on the progress of <u>each health and human services</u> <u>agency</u> [the department] in accomplishing the goals described by Section 107.002 to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives. This report may be combined with any other report required of the <u>commission</u> [department] by law.

6 Sec. 107.008. PERSONNEL AND FACILITIES. The task force is 7 administratively attached to the <u>commission</u> [department]. The 8 <u>commission</u> [department] shall provide the necessary staff and 9 facilities to assist the task force in performing its duties.

10 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act do not affect 11 the entitlement of a member serving on the health disparities task 12 force immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue 13 to carry out the task force's functions for the remainder of the 14 member's term.

15 SECTION 4. (a) On January 1, 2008, or on an earlier date 16 specified by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 17 Services Commission:

(1) the Department of State Health Services shall 18 transfer any property, records, or personnel of the department 19 related to the administration of the Office for the Elimination of 20 21 Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of Minority Health, or the health disparities task force to the Health and Human 22 23 Services Commission to assist the commission to begin administering 24 Chapter 107, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, as efficiently as practicable; 25

26 (2) all powers, duties, functions, activities,
27 obligations, rights, contracts, records, property, and

appropriations or other money of the Office for the Elimination of Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of Minority Health, or the health disparities task force are transferred to the Health and Human Services Commission;

5 (3) a rule or form adopted by the Department of State 6 Health Services that relates to the Office for the Elimination of 7 Health Disparities, the Office of Minority Health, or the health 8 disparities task force is a rule or form of the Health and Human 9 Services Commission and remains in effect until altered by the 10 commission; and

(4) a reference in law or an administrative rule to the Department of State Health Services that relates to the Office for the Elimination of Health Disparities, the Office of Minority Health, or the health disparities task force means the Health and Human Services Commission.

(b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall take all action necessary to provide for the transfer of the Office for Elimination of Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of Minority Health, to the commission as soon as possible after the effective date of this Act but not later than January 1, 2008.
