- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 12, Health and Safety 5
- Code, is transferred to Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, 6
- redesignated as Chapter 107A, Health and Safety Code, and amended 7
- to read as follows: 8

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- CHAPTER 107A [$\frac{\text{SUBCHAPTER G}}{\text{SUBCHAPTER G}}$]. OFFICE FOR THE ELIMINATION OF HEALTH 9
- DISPARITIES [OF MINORITY HEALTH] 10
- Sec. 107A.001 [$\frac{12.081}{}$]. OFFICE FOR THE ELIMINATION 11
- 12 HEALTH DISPARITIES [OF MINORITY HEALTH]. The executive
- 13 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- [department] shall [establish and] maintain an office for the 14
- elimination of health disparities [of minority health] in the 15
- Health and Human Services Commission [department] to: 16
- assume a leadership role in working or contracting 17 (1)
- 18 with state and federal agencies, universities, private interest
- groups, communities, foundations, and offices of minority health to 19
- develop [minority] health initiatives to decrease or eliminate 20
- 21 health and health access disparities among multicultural,
- disadvantaged, and regional populations, including appropriate 22
- 23 language services [bilingual communications]; and
- 24 (2) maximize use of existing resources without

- 1 duplicating existing efforts.
- Sec. 107A.002 [12.082]. POWERS OF OFFICE. The office may:
- 3 (1) provide a central information and referral source,
- 4 including a clearinghouse for health disparities information, and
- 5 serve as the primary state resource in coordinating, planning, and
- 6 advocating access to [minority] health care services to eliminate
- 7 <u>health disparities</u> in this state;
- 8 (2) coordinate conferences and other training
- 9 opportunities to increase skills among state agencies and
- 10 government staff in management and in the appreciation of cultural
- 11 diversity;
- 12 (3) pursue and administer grant funds for innovative
- 13 projects for communities, groups, and individuals;
- 14 (4) provide recommendations and training in improving
- 15 minority recruitment in state agencies;
- 16 (5) publicize <u>information</u> regarding health
- 17 <u>disparities and</u> minority health issues through the use of the
- 18 media;
- 19 (6) network with existing minority organizations,
- 20 community-based health groups, and statewide health coalitions;
- 21 (7) solicit, receive, and spend grants, gifts, and
- donations from public and private sources; and
- 23 (8) contract with public and private entities in the
- 24 performance of its responsibilities.
- Sec. 107A.003 [12.083]. FUNDING. The Health and Human
- 26 Services Commission [department] may distribute to the office
- 27 unobligated and unexpended appropriations to be used to carry out

- 1 its powers.
- 2 [Sec. 12.084. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. Not later than
- 3 January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the office shall submit a
- 4 biennial report to the legislature regarding the activities of the
- 5 office and any findings and recommendations relating to minority
- 6 health issues.
- 7 SECTION 2. Sections 107.001 through 107.004 and 107.008,
- 8 Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 107.001. DEFINITIONS [DEFINITION]. In this chapter:
- 10 <u>(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services</u>
- 11 Commission.
- 12 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 13 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 14 (3) "Health and human services agency" means a health
- and human services agency listed by Section 531.001, Government
- 16 Code.
- 17 (4) "Task [, "task] force" means the health disparities
- 18 task force established under this chapter.
- 19 Sec. 107.002. PURPOSE. The purpose of the task force is to
- 20 assist the commission [department] in accomplishing the following
- 21 goals:
- 22 (1) to eliminate health and health access disparities
- 23 in Texas among multicultural, disadvantaged, and regional
- 24 populations; and
- 25 (2) to structure health and human services agency
- 26 [reorganize department] programs to eliminate health and health
- 27 access [those] disparities.

- 1 Sec. 107.003. DUTIES. (a) The task force shall:
- 2 (1) investigate and report on issues related to health
- 3 and health access disparities among multicultural, disadvantaged,
- 4 and regional populations;
- 5 (2) develop short-term and long-term strategies to
- 6 eliminate health and health access disparities among
- 7 multicultural, disadvantaged, and regional populations, with a
- 8 focus on structuring health and human services agency [reorganizing
- 9 department] programs to eliminate those disparities;
- 10 (3) monitor the progress of <u>each health and human</u>
- 11 services agency [the department] in:
- 12 (A) eliminating [the] health and health access
- 13 disparities; and
- 14 (B) structuring the agency's program activities
- 15 [reorganizing department programs] to eliminate the disparities;
- 16 and
- 17 (4) advise each health and human services agency [the
- 18 department] on the implementation of any targeted programs or
- 19 funding authorized by the legislature to address health and health
- 20 access disparities.
- 21 (b) In performing the duties described in Subsection (a),
- 22 the task force shall consult with <u>each</u> health and human services
- 23 <u>agency</u> [the department], the Office for the Elimination of Health
- 24 Disparities [of Minority Health and Cultural Competency, women's
- 25 health offices of the department], and any other relevant division
- of the commission [the department].
- Sec. 107.004. REPORT. The task force shall submit a

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- 1 biennial report on the progress of <u>each health and human services</u>
- 2 agency [the department] in accomplishing the goals described by
- 3 Section 107.002 to the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker
- 4 of the house of representatives. This report may be combined with
- 5 any other report required of the commission [department] by law.
- 6 Sec. 107.008. PERSONNEL AND FACILITIES. The task force is
- 7 administratively attached to the commission [department]. The
- 8 $\underline{\text{commission}}$ [$\underline{\text{department}}$] shall provide the necessary staff and
- 9 facilities to assist the task force in performing its duties.
- 10 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act do not affect
- 11 the entitlement of a member serving on the health disparities task
- 12 force immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue
- 13 to carry out the task force's functions for the remainder of the
- 14 member's term.
- SECTION 4. (a) On January 1, 2008, or on an earlier date
- 16 specified by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 17 Services Commission:
- 18 (1) the Department of State Health Services shall
- 19 transfer any property, records, or personnel of the department
- 20 related to the administration of the Office for the Elimination of
- 21 Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of Minority
- Health, or the health disparities task force to the Health and Human
- 23 Services Commission to assist the commission to begin administering
- 24 Chapter 107, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, as
- 25 efficiently as practicable;
- 26 (2) all powers, duties, functions, activities,
- 27 obligations, rights, contracts, records, property, and

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- 1 appropriations or other money of the Office for the Elimination of
- 2 Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of Minority
- 3 Health, or the health disparities task force are transferred to the
- 4 Health and Human Services Commission;
- 5 (3) a rule or form adopted by the Department of State
- 6 Health Services that relates to the Office for the Elimination of
- 7 Health Disparities, the Office of Minority Health, or the health
- 8 disparities task force is a rule or form of the Health and Human
- 9 Services Commission and remains in effect until altered by the
- 10 commission; and
- 11 (4) a reference in law or an administrative rule to the
- 12 Department of State Health Services that relates to the Office for
- 13 the Elimination of Health Disparities, the Office of Minority
- 14 Health, or the health disparities task force means the Health and
- 15 Human Services Commission.
- 16 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall take all
- 17 action necessary to provide for the transfer of the Office for
- 18 Elimination of Health Disparities, formerly known as the Office of
- 19 Minority Health, to the commission as soon as possible after the
- 20 effective date of this Act but not later than January 1, 2008.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
