## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to compensation paid to statutory county court judges and 3 certain fees collected by statutory county courts. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 25.0005(a) and (b), Government Code, 6 are amended to read as follows: (a) A statutory county court judge, other than a statutory 7 8 county court judge who engages in the private practice of law [or a judge in whose court fees and costs under Sections 51.702(a) and (b) 9 are not collected], shall be paid a total annual salary set by the 10 11 commissioners court at an amount that is not less than [at least 12 equal to the amount that is] \$1,000 less than the total annual salary received by a district judge in the county [on August 31, 13 14 1999]. A district judge's or statutory county court judge's total annual salary includes contributions and supplements, paid by the 15 16 state or a county, other than contributions received as compensation under Section 74.051. 17 18 Subject to any salary requirements otherwise imposed by (b)

(b) Subject to any salary requirements otherwise imposed by this chapter for a particular court or county, the commissioners court sets the salary of each statutory county court judge who engages in the private practice of law [or in whose court fees and costs under Sections 51.702(a) and (b) are not collected].
