4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 271, Local Government
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 271. PURCHASING, [AND] CONTRACTING, AND RELATED AUTHORITY
8	OF MUNICIPALITIES, COUNTIES, AND CERTAIN
9	OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS
10	SECTION 2. The heading to Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Local
11	Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
12	SUBCHAPTER I. ADJUDICATION OF <u>CONTRACT OR EMPLOYMENT-RELATED</u>
13	CLAIMS <u>AGAINST</u> [ARISING UNDER WRITTEN CONTRACTS WITH] LOCAL
14	GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES
15	SECTION 3. Section 271.152, Local Government Code, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Sec. 271.152. WAIVER OF IMMUNITY TO SUIT FOR CERTAIN
18	CLAIMS. A local governmental entity that is authorized by statute
19	or the constitution to enter into a contract and [that] enters into
20	a contract subject to this subchapter, or that is governed by a
21	state statute or local ordinance affecting the employment rights of
22	<u>a local governmental entity's employees,</u> waives sovereign immunity
23	to suit for the purpose of adjudicating a claim for breach of the
24	contract or a violation of statute or ordinance, subject to the

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1 terms and conditions of this subchapter. SECTION 4. Section 271.153, Local Government Code, 2 is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 3 4 (c) The total amount of money awarded in an adjudication brought against a local governmental entity for violation of a 5 6 statute or ordinance affecting the employment rights of a local 7 governmental entity's employees is limited to: (1) the amount necessary to make the affected 8 individual whole for any violation of rights found to have 9 10 occurred; and (2) interest as allowed by law. 11 SECTION 5. Section 271.155, Local Government Code, 12 is amended to read as follows: 13 Sec. 271.155. NO WAIVER OF OTHER DEFENSES. This subchapter 14 15 does not waive a defense or a limitation on damages available to a person [party to a contract], other than a bar against suit based on 16 17 sovereign immunity. SECTION 6. Section 271.159, Local Government Code, 18 is amended to read as follows: 19 20 Sec. 271.159. NO RECOVERY OF ATTORNEY'S FEES. (a) Attorney's fees incurred by a local governmental entity or any 21 other party in the adjudication of a claim under a contract subject 22 to this subchapter by or against a local governmental entity shall 23 24 not be awarded to any party in the adjudication unless the local governmental entity has entered into a written agreement that 25 expressly authorizes the prevailing party in the adjudication to 26 recover its reasonable and necessary attorney's fees by specific 27

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1 reference to this section.

2 (b) Attorney's fees incurred by a local governmental entity 3 or any other party in the adjudication of a claim under a statute or 4 ordinance affecting the employment rights of a local governmental 5 entity's employees shall not be awarded to any party in the 6 adjudication unless authorized by a statute outside this 7 exhebrator

7 <u>subchapter</u>.

8 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act to Subchapter 9 I, Chapter 271, Local Government Code, apply to any action alleging 10 a violation of Title 5, Local Government Code, or another state 11 statute or a local ordinance affecting employment that has not been 12 finally adjudicated on the effective date of this Act.

13 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
