3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 166 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 166. BILLING OF ANATOMIC PATHOLOGY SERVICES
7	Sec. 166.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "anatomic
8	<pre>pathology services" means:</pre>
9	(1) histopathology or surgical pathology, which is the
10	gross and microscopic examination and histologic processing of
11	organ tissue performed by a physician or under the supervision of a
12	physician;
13	(2) cytopathology, which is the microscopic
14	examination of cells from the following:
15	(A) fluids;
16	(B) aspirates;
17	(C) washings;
18	(D) brushings; or
19	(E) smears, including a Pap smear, performed by a
20	physician or under the supervision of a physician;
21	(3) hematology, which is the microscopic evaluation of
22	bone marrow aspirates and biopsies performed by a physician, or
23	under the supervision of a physician, and peripheral blood smears

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when the attending or treating physician or technologist requests

- that a blood smear be reviewed by a pathologist;
- 2 (4) sub-cellular pathology and molecular pathology;
- 3 <u>or</u>
- 4 (5) a blood-banking service performed by a
- 5 pathologist.
- 6 Sec. 166.002. ANATOMIC PATHOLOGY BILLING. Notwithstanding
- 7 any other law, a person, including a physician and an entity,
- 8 violates this subtitle and is subject to disciplinary action and
- 9 penalties under this subtitle if the person:
- 10 (1) does not directly supervise or perform anatomic
- 11 pathology services for a patient; and
- 12 (2) fails to disclose in the bill presented by the
- 13 person to the patient or the insurer or other third party payor, or
- in an itemized statement to the patient:
- 15 (A) the name and address of the physician or
- 16 <u>laboratory that provided the anatomic pathology services; and</u>
- 17 (B) the net amount paid or to be paid for each
- 18 <u>anatomic pathology service provided to the patient by the physician</u>
- or laboratory.
- 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 166, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 21 Act, applies only to anatomic pathology services performed on or
- 22 after the effective date of this Act.
- 23 SECTION 3. The Texas Medical Board may adopt rules
- 24 necessary to implement Chapter 166, Occupations Code, as added by
- 25 this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
