5	SECTION 1. Section 2254.004, Government Code, is amended to

8	ARCHITECT, <u>LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT</u> , ENGINEER, OR SURVEYOR. (a) In
9	procuring architectural, <u>landscape architectural,</u> engineering, or
10	land surveying services, a governmental entity shall:
11	(1) first select the most highly qualified provider of
12	those services on the basis of demonstrated competence and
13	qualifications; and
14	(2) then attempt to negotiate with that provider a
15	contract at a fair and reasonable price.
16	(b) If a satisfactory contract cannot be negotiated with the
17	most highly qualified provider of architectural, <u>landscape</u>
18	architectural, engineering, or land surveying services, the entity
19	shall:
20	(1) formally end negotiations with that provider;
21	(2) select the next most highly qualified provider;
22	and
23	(3) attempt to negotiate a contract with that provider
24	at a fair and reasonable price.

1 (c) The entity shall continue the process described in 2 Subsection (b) to select and negotiate with providers until a 3 contract is entered into.

4 SECTION 2. (a) This Act applies only to a contract or a 5 construction or other public works project for which a governmental 6 entity first advertises or otherwise requests bids, proposals, 7 offers, or qualifications, or makes a similar solicitation, on or 8 after the effective date of this Act.

9 (b) A contract or a construction or other public works 10 project for which a governmental entity first advertises or 11 otherwise requests bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications, or 12 makes a similar solicitation, before the effective date of this Act 13 is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 14 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 15 that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
