## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.142, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Subsection (i) to read as follows:
- 8 (i) The department may not accept, recognize, or rely on an
- 9 identity document issued to an applicant by a consular office or
- 10 consular official of another country, including a matricula
- 11 consular issued by a consular office of the United Mexican States
- 12 located in this country, as primary, secondary, or supporting proof
- of the applicant's identity.
- 14 SECTION 2. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is
- amended by adding Chapter 2057 to read as follows:
- 16 CHAPTER 2057. RECOGNITION OF CONSULAR IDENTITY DOCUMENTS
- 17 Sec. 2057.001. GOVERNMENTAL RECOGNITION OF CONSULAR
- 18 IDENTITY DOCUMENT OF APPLICANT FOR PUBLIC BENEFIT OR SERVICE. In
- 19 the provision by an agency or political subdivision of this state of
- 20 <u>a public benefit or service that requires the applicant for or</u>
- 21 <u>recipient of the public benefit or service to verify the</u>
- 22 applicant's or recipient's identity, the agency or political

- 6 IDENTITY DOCUMENT OF APPLICANT FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. An agency or
- 7 political subdivision of this state may not accept, recognize, or
- 8 rely on an identity document issued to the applicant by a consular
- 9 office or consular official of another country, including a
- 10 <u>matricula consular issued by a consular office of the United</u>
- 11 Mexican States located in this country, as primary, secondary, or
