A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the provision of state death benefits to certain
- 3 federal law enforcement officers and special agents who assist
- 4 state and local law enforcement agencies in this state.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 615.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 615.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
- 9 eligible survivors of the following individuals:
- 10 (1) an individual elected, appointed, or employed as a
- 11 peace officer by the state or a political subdivision of the state
- 12 under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law;
- 13 (2) a paid probation officer appointed by the director
- 14 of a community supervision and corrections department who has the
- duties set out in Section 76.002 and the qualifications set out in
- 16 Section 76.005, or who was appointed in accordance with prior law;
- 17 (3) a parole officer employed by the pardons and
- 18 paroles division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice who
- 19 has the duties set out in Section 508.001 and the qualifications set
- out in Section 508.113 or in prior law;
- 21 (4) a paid jailer;
- 22 (5) a member of an organized police reserve or
- 23 auxiliary unit who regularly assists peace officers in enforcing
- 24 criminal laws;

- 1 (6) a member of the class of employees of the
- 2 institutional division or the state jail division of the Texas
- 3 Department of Criminal Justice formally designated as custodial
- 4 personnel under Section 615.006 by the Texas Board of Criminal
- 5 Justice or its predecessor in function;
- 6 (7) a jailer or guard of a county jail who is appointed
- 7 by the sheriff and who:
- 8 (A) performs a security, custodial, or
- 9 supervisory function over the admittance, confinement, or
- 10 discharge of prisoners; and
- 11 (B) is certified by the Commission on Law
- 12 Enforcement Officer Standards and Education;
- 13 (8) a juvenile correctional employee of the Texas
- 14 Youth Commission;
- 15 (9) an employee of the [Texas] Department of State
- 16 Health Services or the Department of Aging and Disability Services
- 17 [Mental Health and Mental Retardation] who:
- 18 (A) works at the Department of State Health
- 19 Services' [department's] maximum security unit; or
- 20 (B) performs on-site services for the Texas

- 22 (10) an individual who is employed by the state or a
- 23 political or legal subdivision and is subject to certification by
- the Texas Commission on Fire Protection;

- 1 (12) a member of an organized volunteer fire-fighting
- 2 unit that:
- 3 (A) renders fire-fighting services without
- 4 remuneration; and
- 5 (B) conducts a minimum of two drills each month,
- 6 each two hours long;
- 7 (13) an individual who:
- 8 (A) performs emergency medical services or
- 9 operates an ambulance;
- 10 (B) is employed by a political subdivision of the
- 11 state or is an emergency medical services volunteer as defined by
- 12 Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; and
- 13 (C) is qualified as an emergency care attendant
- or at a higher level of training under Section 773.046, 773.047,
- 773.048, 773.049, or 773.0495, Health and Safety Code; [or]
- 16 (14) an individual who is employed or formally
- 17 designated as a chaplain for:
- 18 (A) an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit or
- 19 other fire department of this state or of a political subdivision of
- 20 this state;
- 21 (B) a law enforcement agency of this state or of a
- 22 political subdivision of this state; or
- 23 (C) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; or
- 24 (15) a federal law enforcement officer or special
- 25 agent, including a special investigator under Article 2.122, Code
- of Criminal Procedure, who is performing duties in this state to
- 27 assist a state or local law enforcement agency of this state.

1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act relating to the death of certain federal law enforcement officers or special 2 agents applies only in relation to a death that occurs on or after 3 4 the effective date of this Act. Matters regarding eligibility, payment, and benefits under Chapter 615, Government Code, in 5 relation to a death that occurs before the effective date of this 6 Act are governed by the law in effect when the death occurs, and the 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 8

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
