A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the use of technology by public schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 32, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 32.007 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 32.007. AGREEMENT WITH PUBLIC BROADCASTING STATION.
- 7 (a) The commissioner may enter into an agreement with a public
- 8 broadcasting station, or a consortium of public broadcasting
- 9 stations, under which the station or consortium will provide online
- 10 instructional content and educational materials.
- 11 (b) From funds appropriated to the agency, the commissioner
- 12 may, under an agreement entered into under Subsection (a), make
- 13 <u>instructional materials available through public broadcasting</u>
- 14 stations for purposes of instruction and professional development
- and for use in providing adult education.
- 16 (c) An agreement entered into under Subsection (a) must, to
- 17 the extent practicable, provide access to instructional materials
- and online content to persons located in all parts of this state.
- 19 (d) For purposes of providing high-quality online
- 20 <u>instructional materials under this section, the commissioner may:</u>
- 21 (1) use federal funds that may be used for those
- 22 purposes; or
- 23 (2) use unexpended balances of funds appropriated to
- 24 the agency for educational purposes, including adult education.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Sections 32.151 and 32.152, Education Code, as
- 2 added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 3 Session, 2003, are amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 32.151. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROJECT. The agency
- 5 may by rule establish the technology immersion pilot project [to
- 6 provide a wireless mobile computing device to each student] in [a]
- 7 participating schools [school and implement the use of software,
- 8 on-line courses, and other appropriate learning technologies that
- 9 have been shown] to improve academic achievement and the progress
- 10 measures listed in Section 32.155(e).
- 11 Sec. 32.152. PILOT PROJECT ADMINISTRATION. The [If the
- 12 agency establishes the pilot project under Section 32.151, the]
- 13 agency shall establish a procedure and develop criteria for the
- 14 administration of the pilot project. In administering the pilot
- 15 project, the agency shall:
- 16 (1) select participating [school districts or]
- 17 schools;
- 18 (2) define the conditions for the distribution and use
- 19 of computer equipment and other technologies;
- 20 (3) purchase and distribute computer equipment and
- 21 other technologies <u>in a manner that provides different technologies</u>
- 22 to different participating campuses;
- 23 (4) enter into contracts as necessary to implement the
- 24 pilot project;
- 25 (5) monitor local pilot project implementation; and
- 26 (6) conduct a final evaluation of the pilot project,
- 27 <u>including an evaluation of the different technologies distributed</u>

- 1 under Subdivision (3).
- 2 SECTION 3. Sections 32.153(a) and (c), Education Code, as
- 3 added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 4 Session, 2003, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) To implement the pilot project, the agency may use any
- 6 gift, grant, or donation given for the pilot project. The agency
- 7 may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or donation of any kind from
- 8 any source, including from a foundation, private entity,
- 9 governmental entity, and institution of higher education, for the
- 10 implementation of the pilot project. The agency may use [only
- 11 undedicated and unobligated] money from the general revenue fund
- 12 for purposes of the pilot project.
- 13 (c) The agency shall use pilot project funds for:
- 14 (1) the purchase of wireless mobile computing devices
- 15 so that each student in a participating classroom has a wireless
- 16 mobile computing device for use at school and at home;
- 17 (2) the purchase of interactive whole group learning
- and assessment tools for each participating classroom;
- 19 (3) the purchase of other equipment, including
- 20 additional computer hardware and software;
- 21 $\underline{(4)}$ [(3)] the hiring of technical support staff for
- 22 school districts or schools participating in the pilot project;
- 23 and
- 24 (5) [(4)] the purchase of technology-based learning
- 25 materials and resources.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Section 32.154, Education Code,
- 27 as added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular

- 1 Session, 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 32.154. [DISTRICT OR] SCHOOL SELECTION.
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 32.154, Education Code, as added by
- 4 Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
- is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b)
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a-1) In addition to school districts and schools selected
- 8 before September 1, 2007, for participation in the technology
- 9 immersion pilot project, the agency shall select for participation
- in the pilot project for the 2007-2008 and subsequent school years:
- 11 (1) each high school to which a district regularly
- 12 assigns students who were enrolled in grade eight during the
- 13 2006-2007 school year at a district school participating in the
- 14 pilot project; and
- 15 (2) one middle or junior high school and one high
- 16 school in each state senatorial district.
- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1)(1), the [The]
- 18 agency shall select the participating [districts and] schools for
- 19 the pilot project based on each [district's or] school's need for
- 20 the pilot project. In selecting participants, the agency shall
- 21 consider the following criteria:
- 22 (1) whether the [district or] school has limited
- 23 access to educational resources that could be improved through the
- 24 use of electronic textbooks or technological equipment that
- 25 contributes to student learning [wireless mobile computing devices
- 26 and other technologies];
- 27 (2) whether the [district or] school has the following

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- 1 problems and whether those problems can be mitigated through the
- 2 use of electronic textbooks or technological equipment that
- 3 contributes to student learning [wireless mobile computing devices
- 4 and other technologies]:
- 5 (A) documented teacher shortages in critical
- 6 areas;
- 7 (B) limited access to advanced placement
- 8 courses;
- 9 (C) low rates of satisfactory performance on
- 10 assessment instruments under Subchapter B, Chapter 39; and
- 11 (D) high dropout rates;
- 12 (3) the [district's or] school's readiness to
- incorporate technology into its classrooms;
- 14 (4) the possibility of obtaining a trained technology
- 15 support staff and high-speed Internet services for the [district
- 16 or] school; and
- 17 (5) the methods the [district or] school will use to
- 18 measure the progress of the pilot project in the district or school
- in accordance with Section 32.155(e).
- SECTION 6. Sections 32.154(a) and (c), Education Code, as
- 21 added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 22 Session, 2003, are repealed.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
