- 2 relating to the applicability of provisions of the Education Code
- 3 to certain alternative education programs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 29.081(e), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (e) A school district may use a private or public
- 8 community-based dropout recovery education program to provide
- 9 alternative education programs for students at risk of dropping out
- 10 of school. The programs must:
- 11 (1) provide not less than the minimum amount [four
- 12 hours of instructional time per day required under Section
- 13 25.082(a);
- 14 (2) employ as faculty and administrators persons with
- 15 baccalaureate or advanced degrees who meet all certification
- requirements established under Subchapter B, Chapter 21;
- 17 (3) provide at least one instructor for each 28
- 18 students;
- 19 (4) perform satisfactorily according to performance
- 20 indicators and accountability standards adopted for alternative
- 21 education programs by the commissioner; and
- 22 (5) comply with this title and rules adopted under
- 23 this title except as otherwise provided by this subsection.
- SECTION 2. Sections 37.008(a) through (c), Education Code,

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- 1 are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Each school district shall provide a disciplinary
- 3 alternative education program that:
- 4 (1) is provided in a setting other than a student's
- 5 regular classroom;
- 6 (2) is located on or off of a regular school campus;
- 7 (3) provides for the students who are assigned to the
- 8 disciplinary alternative education program to be separated from
- 9 students who are not assigned to the program;
- 10 (4) focuses on English language arts, mathematics,
- 11 science, history, and self-discipline;
- 12 (5) provides for students' educational and behavioral
- 13 needs;
- 14 (6) provides supervision and counseling;
- 15 (7) employs only teachers who [requires that to teach
- 16 in an off-campus disciplinary alternative education program, each
- 17 teacher] meet all certification requirements established under
- 18 Subchapter B, Chapter 21; and
- 19 (8) provides not less than the minimum amount of
- 20 instructional time per day required by Section 25.082(a)
- 21 [notwithstanding Subdivision (7), requires that to teach in a
- 22 disciplinary alternative education program of any kind, each
- 23 teacher employed by a school district during the 2003-2004 school
- 24 year or an earlier school year meet, not later than the beginning of
- 25 the 2005-2006 school year, all certification requirements
- 26 <u>established under Subchapter B, Chapter 21</u>].
- 27 (b) A disciplinary alternative education program may

- 1 provide for a student's transfer to:
- 2 (1) a different campus;
- 3 (2) a school-community guidance center <u>under</u>
- 4 <u>Subchapter B</u>; or
- 5 (3) a community-based alternative school, including a
- 6 community-based dropout recovery education program under Section
- 7 <u>29.081(e)</u>.
- 8 (c) An off-campus disciplinary alternative education
- 9 program, including a school-community guidance center, a
- 10 community-based alternative school, or a community-based dropout
- 11 recovery education program, is not subject to a requirement imposed
- 12 by this title, other than:
- 13 (1) a limitation on liability;
- 14 (2) [7] a reporting requirement;
- 15 $\underline{(3)}$ [τ or] a requirement imposed by this chapter or by
- 16 Chapter 39; or
- 17 (4) any other requirement imposed by this title that
- 18 applies to an on-campus disciplinary alternative education
- 19 program.
- SECTION 3. Sections 29.081(e) and 37.008, Education Code,
- 21 as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the 2007-2008 school
- 22 year.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
