- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter M, Chapter 202, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 202.6035 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 202.6035. CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS. (a) A board
- 8 investigator may investigate suspected criminal acts relating to
- 9 the practice of podiatry as authorized by this chapter and shall
- 10 assist federal, state, or local law enforcement agencies in the
- investigation and prosecution of offenses related to the practice
- 12 of podiatry.

- (b) In conducting a criminal investigation, the board may
- 14 receive relevant information from a law enforcement agency.
- 15 Information received by the board from a law enforcement agency is
- 16 confidential and may not be disclosed except as necessary to
- 17 conduct the investigation.
- 18 <u>(c) A board investigator conducting a criminal</u>
- 19 investigation is not a peace officer.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
