## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to certain educational requirements applicable to the
- 3 regulation of the practice of chiropractic.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 201.052(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person is not eligible to serve as a member of the
- 8 board if the person:
- 9 (1) is a member of the faculty or board of trustees of
- 10 a chiropractic school or a doctoral chiropractic degree program;
- 11 (2) is a stockholder in a chiropractic school or
- 12 college; or
- 13 (3) has a financial interest in a chiropractic school
- or college.
- SECTION 2. Section 201.159(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (a) The board shall preserve a record of its proceedings in
- 18 a register that contains:
- 19 (1) the name, age, place, and duration of residence of
- 20 each applicant for a license;
- 21 (2) the amount of time spent by the applicant in the
- 22 study of chiropractic in respective <u>doctoral</u> chiropractic <u>degree</u>
- 23 programs [schools]; and
- 24 (3) other information the board desires to record.

- 1 SECTION 3. Sections 201.302(a) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) An applicant for a license by examination must present
- 4 satisfactory evidence to the board that the applicant:
- 5 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 6 (2) is of good moral character;
- 7 (3) has completed 90 semester hours of college courses
- 8 [at a school] other than courses included in a doctoral
- 9 chiropractic degree program [school]; and
- 10 (4) is either a graduate or a final semester student of
- 11 a bona fide reputable <u>doctoral</u> chiropractic <u>degree program</u>
- 12 [school].
- (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(3), if the Council on
- 14 Chiropractic Education or another national chiropractic education
- 15 accreditation organization recognized by the board requires a
- 16 number of semester hours of college courses [at a school] other than
- 17 courses included in a doctoral chiropractic degree program [school]
- 18 that is greater or less than the number of hours specified by that
- 19 subsection to qualify for admission to a <u>doctoral</u> chiropractic
- 20 degree program [school], the board may adopt the requirement of
- 21 that organization if the board determines that requirement to be
- 22 appropriate.
- 23 SECTION 4. Section 201.303(d), Occupations Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (d) A bona fide reputable doctoral chiropractic degree
- program [school] that satisfies Section 201.302(a)(4) is one that:
- 27 (1) has entrance requirements and a course of

- 1 instruction as high as those of a better class of <u>doctoral</u>
- 2 chiropractic <u>degree programs</u> [schools] in the United States;
- 3 (2) maintains a resident course of instruction
- 4 equivalent to:
- 5 (A) not less than four terms of eight months
- 6 each; or
- 7 (B) not less than the number of semester hours
- 8 required by The University of Texas for a bachelor of arts or
- 9 bachelor of science degree;
- 10 (3) provides a course of instruction in the
- 11 fundamental subjects listed in Section 201.305(b); and
- 12 (4) has the necessary teaching staff and facilities
- 13 for proper instruction in all of the fundamental subjects listed in
- 14 Section 201.305(b).
- SECTION 5. Section 201.309, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 201.309. LICENSE ISSUANCE TO CERTAIN OUT-OF-STATE
- 18 APPLICANTS. The board shall issue a license to practice
- 19 chiropractic to an out-of-state applicant who:
- 20 (1) submits a written application to the board on a
- 21 form prescribed by the board, accompanied by the application fee
- set by the board and any other information requested by the board;
- 23 (2) is licensed in good standing to practice
- 24 chiropractic in another state or foreign country that has licensing
- 25 requirements substantially equivalent to the requirements of this
- 26 chapter;
- 27 (3) has not been the subject of a disciplinary action

- 1 and is not the subject of a pending investigation in any
- 2 jurisdiction in which the applicant is or has been licensed;
- 3 (4) has graduated from a <u>doctoral</u> chiropractic <u>degree</u>
- 4 program [school] accredited by the Council on Chiropractic
- 5 Education and approved by rule by the board;
- 6 (5) has passed a national or other examination
- 7 recognized by the board relating to the practice of chiropractic;
  - (6) has passed the board's jurisprudence examination;
- 9 (7) has practiced chiropractic:
- 10 (A) for at least the three years immediately
- 11 preceding the date of the application under this section; or
- 12 (B) as a chiropractic educator in [at] a doctoral
- 13 chiropractic degree program [school] accredited by the Council on
- 14 Chiropractic Education for at least the three years immediately
- 15 preceding the date of the application under this section; and
- 16 (8) meets any other requirements adopted by rule by
- 17 the board under this chapter.

- 18 SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies to an
- 19 applicant who files an application for a license under Chapter 201,
- 20 Occupations Code, on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 21 applicant who files an application before that date is governed by
- 22 the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the
- former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

1 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
