- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 193.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 193.002. PERSON REQUIRED TO FILE. The person in
- 8 charge of interment or in charge of removal of a body from a
- 9 registration district for disposition shall:
- 10 (1) obtain and file the death certificate or fetal
- 11 death certificate;
- 12 (2) enter on the certificate the information relating
- 13 to disposition of the body; [and]
- 14 (3) sign the certificate; and
- 15 (4) file the certificate electronically as specified
- 16 by the state registrar.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 193.005(h), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (h) The person completing the medical certification shall
- 20 <u>submit the information and</u> attest to its validity <u>using</u> [either by
- 21 signature or by] an electronic process approved by the state
- 22 registrar.
- SECTION 3. (a) Notwithstanding Sections 193.002 and
- 24 193.005, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, any funeral

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- 1 home that does not on the effective date of this Act renew its
- 2 establishment license electronically is not required to comply with
- 3 the change in law made by this Act before September 1, 2008.
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding Sections 193.002 and 193.005, Health
- 5 and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, any doctor that does not on
- 6 the effective date of this Act renew the doctor's license online is
- 7 not required to comply with the change in law made by this Act
- 8 before September 1, 2008.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
