1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of political subdivisions to negotiate
3	contracts for electricity.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 304, Local Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 304.0015 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 304.0015. CONTRACT TERMS; AUTHORITY TO DELEGATE. (a)
8	A contract between a political subdivision and a political
9	subdivision corporation described by Section 304.001 for the
10	purchase of electricity, in whole or in part, authorized under
11	Subchapter A, Chapter 271:
12	(1) may be for a term not to exceed 30 years;
13	(2) is a security agreement within the meaning of
14	Section 1208.001, Government Code; and
15	(3) is exempt from Chapter 252 or 262, as appropriate,
16	or other law that establishes a competitive purchasing process
17	that, otherwise, would apply to the contract.

- (b) In authorizing a political subdivision corporation to
- 19 <u>negotiate a contract, the governing body of each political</u>
- 20 <u>subdivision that forms the political subdivision corporation may:</u>
- 21 (1) authorize the maximum amount of any payment and 22 the maximum rate of interest under the contract;
- 23 (2) authorize the maximum amount of electricity to be
- 24 purchased under the contract; and

1	(3) delegate to any officer or employee of the
2	political subdivision the authority to:
3	(A) determine the payment terms of the contract;
4	(B) determine the specific amount of electricity
5	purchased; and
6	(C) complete and execute the contract.
7	(c) In exercising the authority delegated under Subsection
8	(b)(3), the officer or employee may establish the terms to complete
9	and execute the contract, including:
10	(1) the form of the contract;
11	(2) the payment terms of the contract, including the
12	price paid, payment amounts, and interest rate under the contract;
13	(3) the relevant contract dates, including payment
14	dates;
15	(4) the redemption or prepayment provisions; and
16	(5) any other details relating to completing and
17	executing the contract specified by the governing body of the
18	political subdivision in a proceeding authorizing the contract.
19	(d) A finding or determination made by an officer or
20	employee exercising the authority delegated under Subsection
21	(b)(3) has the same force and effect as a finding or determination
22	made by the governing body of the political subdivision.
23	(e) A political subdivision that enters into a contract
24	under this section has the same contracting authority as a
25	municipality contracting with a utility system under Section
26	1502.002, Government Code.
27	(f) A political subdivision that enters into a contract

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under this section is not required to submit the contract to a 1 2 public official of this state, including the attorney general, for review and approval. A political subdivision may submit the 3 4 contract to a public official for review and approval if authorized by law. A contract under this section may not be contested after 5 6 the contract is executed and delivered except for fraud or forgery. 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 11
