10	(1) the officer arrests the person for an offense
11	under Chapter 49, Penal Code, involving the operation of a motor
12	vehicle or a watercraft; <u>and</u>
13	(2) <u>either:</u>
14	(A) the person was the operator of a motor
15	vehicle or a watercraft involved in an accident that the officer
16	reasonably believes occurred as a result of the offense $\underline{ ext{and,}}$ [+
17	$[\frac{(3)}{1}]$ at the time of the arrest, the officer
18	reasonably believes that as a direct result of the accident:
19	$\underline{\text{(i)}}$ $[\frac{\text{(A)}}{\text{A}}]$ any individual has died or will

21	$\underline{\text{(ii)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(B)}}{\text{B}}$] an individual other than the

possesses or receives reliable information from a credible source

(B) at the time of the arrest, the officer

- 1 that the person has been previously arrested on two or more
- 2 occasions for an offense under Chapter 49, Penal Code, involving
- 3 the operation of a motor vehicle or a watercraft [and
- 4 [(4) the person refuses the officer's request to

- 6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and
- 10 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 11 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 12 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 13 committed before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
