4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 776, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Sections 776.0335 and 776.0336 to read as

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- 8 Sec. 776.0335. ELECTION OF BOARD IN DISTRICT LOCATED IN ONE
- 9 COUNTY. (a) This section applies only to a county that borders or
- 10 contains a portion of the Neches River, the Sabine River, and Sabine
- 11 Lake.
- 12 (b) The governing body of a district converted under Section
- 13 776.0336 and wholly located in the county consists of a five-person
- 14 board of emergency commissioners elected at large as prescribed by
- 15 this section. Except as provided by Subsection (f), an emergency
- 16 commissioner serves a two-year term.
- 17 (c) After the district is converted, the county judge may
- order an election to elect the initial emergency commissioners at
- 19 the next available uniform election date that allows sufficient
- time to comply with other requirements of law.
- 21 (d) To be eligible as a candidate for emergency commissioner
- 22 for the district, a person must be at least 18 years of age and a
- 23 resident of the district.
- (e) A candidate for emergency commissioner must give the

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- 1 county clerk a sworn notice of the candidate's intention to run for
- office. The notice must state the person's name, age, and address
- 3 and state that the person intends to run for emergency
- 4 commissioner. On receipt of the notice, the county clerk shall have
- 5 the candidate's name placed on the ballot.
- 6 (f) The two initial emergency commissioners who received
- 7 the fewest votes serve one-year terms. The other commissioners
- 8 serve two-year terms.
- 9 (g) After the election is held, the county clerk or the
- 10 clerk's deputy shall prepare a sworn statement of the election
- 11 costs incurred by the county. The statement shall be given to the
- 12 newly elected board, which shall order the appropriate official to
- 13 reimburse the county for the county's election costs.
- 14 (h) The general election for commissioner shall be held
- annually on an authorized election date as provided by Chapter 41,
- 16 <u>Election Code</u>.
- 17 Sec. 776.0336. CONVERSION OF APPOINTED BOARD TO ELECTED
- 18 BOARD. (a) This section applies only to a county that borders or
- 19 contains a portion of the Neches River, the Sabine River, and Sabine
- 20 Lake.
- (b) A board by resolution may convert to an elected board
- 22 under <u>Section 776.0335.</u>
- 23 (c) An emergency services commissioner serving on the board
- 24 immediately before the date of the resolution continues to carry
- out the board's functions until the election and qualification of a
- 26 new commissioner for that position.
- 27 (d) This section does not prohibit a person who is a

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- 1 commissioner on the date of the resolution from running for
- 2 <u>election to the board if the person has the qualifications required</u>
- 3 for a member under Section 776.0335.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
