- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Sarah Kathryn
- 6 Thompson Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 550.021(c), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (c) A person commits an offense if the person does not stop
- 10 or does not comply with the requirements of this section. An
- 11 offense under this section:
- 12 <u>(1) involving an accident resulting in death of or</u>
- 13 serious bodily injury, as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, to a
- 14 person is a felony of the third degree; and
- 15 (2) involving an accident resulting in injury to which
- 16 Subdivision (1) does not apply is punishable by:
- 17 $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ [\(\frac{\(\)(1)}{\(\)}\)] imprisonment in the [\(\)institutional
- 18 division of the] Texas Department of Criminal Justice for not more
- 19 than five years or confinement in the county jail for not more than
- 20 one year;
- (B) $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ a fine not to exceed \$5,000; or
- (C) $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ both the fine and the imprisonment or

- SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies

- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 2 Act. For the purposes of this section, an offense is committed
- 3 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 4 occurs before that date.
- 5 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 6 Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
