## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of a county to regulate the installation
3	and use of lighting in certain areas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 240.031, Local Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Subdivision (4) to read as follows:
7	(4) "Agricultural use" has the meaning assigned by
8	Section 23.51, Tax Code.

- 9 SECTION 2. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 240, Local 10 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 SUBCHAPTER B. OUTDOOR LIGHTING NEAR
- 12 OBSERVATORIES AND MILITARY INSTALLATIONS
- SECTION 3. Section 240.032, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Subsection (b-1) and amending Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
- 16 (b-1) On the request of a United States military

  17 installation, base, or camp commanding officer, the commissioners

  18 court of a county, any part of which is located immediately adjacent

  19 to the installation, base, or camp, may adopt orders regulating the

  20 installation and use of outdoor lighting within five miles of the

  21 installation, base, or camp in any unincorporated territory of the

  22 county.
- (c) The orders must be designed to protect against the use of outdoor lighting in a way that interferes with scientific

- 1 astronomical research of the observatory or military and training
- 2 activities of the military installation, base, or camp. In the
- 3 orders, the commissioners court may:
- 4 (1) require that a permit be obtained from the county
- 5 before the installation and use of certain types of outdoor
- 6 lighting in a regulated area;
- 7 (2) establish a fee <u>in an amount to cover the costs of</u>
- 8 administrating the order for the issuance of the permit;
- 9 (3) prohibit the use of a type of outdoor lighting that
- 10 is incompatible with the effective use of the observatory or
- military installation, base, or camp;
- 12 (4) establish requirements for the shielding of
- 13 outdoor lighting; and
- 14 (5) regulate the times during which certain types of
- 15 outdoor lighting may be used.
- 16 (d) The commissioners court may apply more stringent
- 17 standards for areas in which the use of outdoor lighting has a
- 18 greater impact on observatory or military installation, base, or
- 19 camp activities.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 240, Local Government
- 21 Code, is amended by adding Section 240.0325 to read as follows:
- Sec. 240.0325. EXCEPTION FOR CERTAIN OUTDOOR LIGHTING. The
- 23 commissioners court may not adopt an order under Section 240.032
- 24 regulating the installation and use of outdoor lighting that:
- 25 (1) was installed or used before the effective date of
- 26 the order and is necessary for the operations of:
- 27 (A) an electric utility, power generation

- 1 company, or transmission and distribution utility, as those terms
- 2 are defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code;
- 3 (B) a gas utility, as defined by Section 101.003
- 4 or 121.001, Utilities Code;
- 5 (C) surface coal mining and reclamation
- 6 operations, as defined by Section 134.004, Natural Resources Code;
- 7 <u>or</u>
- 8 (D) a telecommunications provider, as defined by
- 9 Section 51.002, Utilities Code, or its affiliates; or
- 10 (2) is owned or maintained for the purpose of
- 11 illuminating:
- 12 (A) a tract of land that is maintained as a single
- 13 family residence and that is located outside the boundaries of a
- 14 platted subdivision;
- 15 (B) a tract of land maintained for agricultural
- 16 <u>use;</u>
- 17 (C) an activity that takes place on a tract of
- 18 land maintained for agricultural use;
- 19 (D) structures or related improvements located
- on a tract of land maintained for agricultural use; or
- (E) a correctional facility operated by or under
- 22 a contract with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- 23 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
