- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 63.202(f) and (g), Education Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (f) Notwithstanding the limitation provided by Subsection
- 9 (b), grants awarded under Subsection (c) for the state fiscal
- 10 biennium ending on August 31, 2009 [2005], and the fiscal biennium
- ending on August 31, 2011 [2007], by the Texas Higher Education
- 12 Coordinating Board shall be awarded to programs preparing students
- 13 for initial licensure as registered nurses or programs preparing
- 14 qualified faculty members with a master's or doctoral degree for
- the program, including programs at two-year institutions of higher
- 16 education, four-year general academic teaching institutions,
- 17 health science centers, and independent or private institutions of
- 18 higher education. In awarding grants under this subsection, the
- 19 coordinating board may:
- 20 (1) give priority to institutions proposing to address
- 21 the shortage of registered nurses by promoting innovation in
- 22 education, recruitment, and retention of nursing students and
- 23 qualified faculty;
- 24 (2) award grants on a competitive basis; and

- 1 (3) consider the availability of matching funds.
- 2 (g) Subsection (f) and this subsection expire September 1, $\frac{2011}{9}$ [2007].
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
