## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the use of certain devices in a polling place.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 61, Election Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 61.013 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 61.013. USE OF CERTAIN DEVICES. (a) A person may not
- 7 <u>use a wireless communication device in a polling place.</u>
- 8 (b) A person may not use any mechanical or electronic means
- 9 of recording images or sound in a polling place.
- 10 (c) The presiding judge may require a person who violates
- 11 this section to turn off the device or to leave the polling place.
- 12 (d) This section does not apply to:
- 13 (1) an election officer in conducting the officer's
- 14 official duties; or
- 15 (2) the use of election equipment necessary for the
- 16 conduct of the election.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 62, Election Code, is amended by adding
- 18 Section 62.0111 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 62.0111. NOTICE OF PROHIBITION OF CERTAIN DEVICES.
- 20 (a) At the discretion of the presiding judge, notice of the
- 21 prohibition of the use of certain devices under Section 61.013 may
- 22 be posted at one or more locations in the polling place where it can
- 23 be read by persons waiting to vote.
- 24 (b) The secretary of state shall prescribe the wording of a

- 2 SECTION 3. Section 33.052, Election Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 33.052. HOURS OF SERVICE AT PRECINCT POLLING PLACE.
- 5 (a) A watcher at a precinct polling place may begin service at any
- 6 time after the presiding judge arrives at the polling place on
- 7 election day and may remain at the polling place until the presiding
- 8 judge and the clerks complete their duties there. A watcher that
- 9 serves for more than five continuous hours may serve at the polling
- 10 place during the hours the watcher chooses, except that if the
- 11 watcher is present at the polling place when ballots are counted,
- 12 the watcher may not leave until the counting is complete.
- 13 (b) For purposes of this section, a watcher is considered to
- 14 have served continuously if the watcher leaves the polling place
- for the purpose of using a wireless communication device prohibited
- from use in the polling place under Section 61.013 and the watcher
- 17 promptly returns.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
