5	SECTION 1. Section 42.2516, Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
7	follows:
8	(b) Subject to Subsections <u>(b-1),</u> (g) <u>,</u> and (h), but
9	notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a school
10	district is entitled to state revenue necessary to provide the
11	district with the sum of:
12	(1) the amount of state revenue necessary to maintain
13	state and local revenue per student in weighted average daily
14	attendance in the amount equal to the greater of:
15	(A) the amount of state and local revenue per
16	student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance
17	and operations of the district available to the district for the
18	2005-2006 school year;
19	(B) the amount of state and local revenue per
20	student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance
21	and operations of the district to which the district would have been
22	entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it
23	existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been
24	subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006,

the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations tax at the rate adopted by the district for the 2005 tax year; or

5 (C) the amount of state and local revenue per 6 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance 7 and operations of the district to which the district would have been 8 entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it 9 existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006, 10 the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that 11 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 12 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations 13 14 tax at the rate equal to the rate described by Section 26.08(i) or (k)(1), Tax Code, as applicable, for the 2006 tax year; 15

equal to the product of amount 16 (2) an \$2,500 17 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B, 18 19 Chapter 21, and full-time school nurses employed by the district and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; and 20

(3) an amount equal to the product of \$275 multiplied
by the number of students in average daily attendance in grades nine
through 12 in the district.

24 (b-1) The amount determined for a school district under

26 (1) if for any school year the district is entitled to 27 a greater allotment under Section 42.158 than the allotment to

No. 1922 1 which the district was entitled under that section for the school 2 year on which the district's entitlement under Subsection (b) is based, the district's entitlement under Subsection (b) is increased 3 4 by an amount equal to the difference between the amount to which the 5 district is entitled under Section 42.158 for that school year and 6 the amount to which the district was entitled under that section 7 for: (A) the 2005-2006 school year, if the amount 8 determined for the district under Subsection (b) is determined 9 10 under Subsection (b)(1)(A); or (B) the 2006-2007 school year, if the amount 11 12 determined for the district under Subsection (b) is determined under Subsection (b)(1)(B) or (C); and 13 14 (2) if for any school year the district is not entitled 15 to an allotment under Section 42.158 or is entitled to a lesser allotment under that section than the allotment to which the 16 17 district was entitled under that section for the school year on which the district's entitlement under Subsection (b) is based, the 18 19 district's entitlement under Subsection (b) is reduced by an amount equal to the difference between the amount to which the district was 20 21 entitled under Section 42.158 for the 2005-2006 or 2006-2007 school year, as appropriate based on whether the district's entitlement 22 under Subsection (b) is determined under Subsection (b)(1)(A), (B), 23 24 or (C), and the amount to which the district is entitled under Section 42.158 for the current school year. 25 26

26 SECTION 2. Section 46.033, Education Code, is amended to 27 read as follows:

Sec. 46.033. ELIGIBLE BONDS. Bonds, including bonds issued under Section 45.006, are eligible to be paid with state and local funds under this subchapter if:

4 (1) the district made payments on the bonds during the 5 <u>2006-2007</u> [2004-2005] school year or taxes levied to pay the 6 principal of and interest on the bonds were included in the 7 district's audited debt service collections for that school year; 8 and

9 (2) the district does not receive state assistance 10 under Subchapter A for payment of the principal and interest on the 11 bonds.

SECTION 3. Section 46.034(c), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

If the amount required to pay the principal of and 14 (C) 15 interest on eligible bonds in a school year is less than the amount of payments made by the district on the bonds during the 2006-2007 16 [2004-2005] school year or the district's audited debt service 17 collections for that school year, the district may not receive aid 18 in excess of the amount that, when added to the district's local 19 revenue for the school year, equals the amount required to pay the 20 21 principal of and interest on the bonds.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
