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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to funding for career and technology programs in public 3 schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 42.154, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1) to 7 read as follows:

8 (a) For each full-time equivalent student <u>in grades eight</u> 9 <u>through 12</u> in average daily attendance in an approved career and 10 technology education program [<del>in grades nine through 12</del>] or in <u>a</u> 11 career and technology education <u>program</u> [<del>programs</del>] for students 12 with disabilities in <u>grade</u> [<del>grades</del>] seven [<del>through 12</del>], a district 13 is entitled to an annual allotment equal to the adjusted basic 14 allotment multiplied by a weight of 1.35.

(a-1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, 15 the commissioner shall develop and implement a pilot program under 16 which a school district is entitled to additional funding for each 17 student receiving career and technology instruction in grade seven. 18 The commissioner shall select either the Region Six education 19 service center or the Region 20 education service center for 20 21 participation in the pilot program. For each full-time equivalent student in grade seven in average daily attendance in an approved 22 23 career and technology education program, a school district that is located primarily in the service region of the regional education 24

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service center selected by the commissioner under this subsection 1 2 is entitled to an annual allotment equal to the adjusted basic allotment multiplied by a weight of 1.35. Funds allocated under 3 4 this subsection, other than an indirect cost allotment established under State Board of Education rule, must be used in providing 5 6 career and technology programs in grade seven under Sections 29.182, 29.183, and 29.184. A school district is entitled to an 7 allotment under this section for each school year through the 8 completion of the 2011-2012 school year. Not later than January 1, 9 2013, the agency shall prepare and deliver to each member of the 10 legislature a report describing the effectiveness of the pilot 11 program described by this subsection. This subsection expires 12 February 1, 2013. 13

14 (c) Funds allocated under this section, other than an 15 indirect cost allotment established under State Board of Education 16 rule, must be used in providing career and technology education 17 programs [in grades nine through 12 or career and technology 18 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven 19 through 12] under Sections 29.182, 29.183, and 29.184 for students 20 described by Subsection (a).

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
