A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the regulation of interior designers; providing

- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1051.001, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (1-a) "Architectural interior construction" means a
- 8 building project that involves only the inside elements of a
- 9 building and that requires the practice of architecture in order to
- 10 be completed.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 1051, Occupations Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 1051.3515 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1051.3515. RENEWAL OF INTERIOR DESIGNER CERTIFICATE OF
- 14 REGISTRATION. To be eligible to renew a certificate of
- 15 <u>registration</u>, an interior designer who has not passed the
- 16 examination of the National Council for Interior Design
- 17 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the
- 18 board must:
- 19 <u>(1) complete, in addition to the continuing education</u>
- 20 requirements required for renewal of the certificate of
- 21 registration under Section 1051.356, 15 hours of board-approved
- 22 continuing education classes relating to building and barrier-free
- 23 codes and regulations and:
- 24 (A) pass section one of that examination or pass

- 1 a comparable section of an examination of a similar national
- 2 organization recognized by the board; or
- 3 (B) demonstrate 20 years of board-approved
- 4 <u>interior design experience; or</u>
- 5 (2) have passed the examination required for
- 6 registration as an architect.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 1053.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), this [This]
- 11 chapter does not apply to:
- 12 (1) a person who [\div
- 13 [(A) does not use the title "interior designer"
- 14 and does not use the term "interior design" to describe a service
- 15 the person offers or performs; and
- 16 [(B)] is an interior designer licensed or
- 17 registered in another state or country who:
- (A) $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$ does not open or maintain a business in
- 19 this state; and
- 20 $\underline{\text{(B)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(ii)}}{\text{)}}$] complies with the requirements of
- 21 Subsection (b); [or]
- 22 (2) a person who is registered to practice
- 23 architecture in this state; or
- 24 (3) an individual who is a member of a state or
- 25 national organization whose members are building designers and that
- 26 requires its members to complete at least eight hours of continuing
- 27 education each year on topics relating to building design, code

- compliance, and building materials in order to maintain 1 2 certification as a professional building designer. (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), this chapter does 3 4 not: 5 (1) prohibit an employee of a retail establishment 6 from providing consultations regarding interior decoration or furnishings for a single-family or dual-family dwelling: 7 8 (A) on the premises of the retail establishment; 9 or 10 (B) in furtherance of a retail sale or 11 prospective retail sale; (2) restrict the activities of a person who does not 12 represent that the person is an interior designer and who provides 13 decorative services or assistance in the selection of surface 14 15 materials, window coverings, wall coverings, paint, floor coverings, surface-mounted fixtures, or loose furnishings if the 16 17 selected items: (A) are for a building that is not intended for 18 public accommodation, as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 12181; and 19 20 (B) are not subject to regulation under the fire 21 code governing the location where the items will be used; or 22 (3) prevent or restrict a person from engaging in a practice or occupation for which the person is licensed or 23 24 registered in this state to engage by: 25 (A) the Texas Board of Architectural Examiners;

- 1 (C) the Texas Board of Professional Engineers;
- 2 (D) the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners;
- 3 or
- 4 (E) the Texas Residential Construction
- 5 Commission.
- 6 (d) A person may not represent that the person is an
- 7 <u>interior designer by using any form of the title "interior</u>
- 8 <u>designer" unless the person is registered under this chapter or</u>
- 9 Chapter 1051.
- SECTION 4. Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1053.151. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. A person other than
- 13 an interior designer may not:
- 14 (1) engage in the practice of interior design for
- direct or indirect compensation or offer or attempt to engage in the
- 16 practice of interior design for direct or indirect compensation
- 17 [represent that the person is an "interior designer" by using that
- 18 title]; or
- 19 (2) represent that the person is engaged in the
- 20 practice of interior design, unless all interior design services
- 21 provided by the person are rendered or supervised by a person
- 22 registered under this chapter or Chapter 1051 [, by using the term
- 23 "interior design," a service the person offers or performs].
- SECTION 5. Section 1053.152(b), Occupations Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- 26 (b) To be eligible for a certificate of registration, an
- 27 applicant must:

- 1 (1) meet the qualifications established by the board
- 2 under Subsection (a);
- 3 (2) pass the [registration] examination of the
- 4 National Council for Interior Design Qualification or of a similar
- 5 national organization recognized by the board; [and]
- 6 (3) pay the required fees;
- 7 (4) hold a professional degree in interior design
- 8 conferred by a design program accredited by the Council for
- 9 Interior Design Accreditation or by a substantially equivalent
- 10 accreditation program, as determined by the board; and
- 11 <u>(5) have completed the Interior Design Experience</u>
- 12 Program administered by the National Council for Interior Design
- 13 Qualification or a substantially equivalent program as determined
- 14 by the board.
- SECTION 6. Section 1053.154(b), Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (b) The examination must cover subjects established by and
- 18 must be graded according to board rules. The board by rule shall
- 19 [may] adopt the examination of the National Council for Interior
- 20 Design Qualification or the examination of a similar national
- 21 <u>organization recognized by the board [comparable examination</u>].
- 22 SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 1053.161 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1053.161. WAIVER OF REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 25 CERTAIN OUT-OF-STATE APPLICANTS. The board may waive any
- 26 registration requirement for an applicant who:
- 27 (1) is licensed or registered to practice interior

- 1 design by another state that has licensing or registration
- 2 requirements at least as stringent as the requirements of this
- 3 state;
- 4 (2) is in good standing with the state that issued the
- 5 license or registration;
- 6 (3) submits an application and pays an administrative
- 7 <u>fee to the board; and</u>
- 8 (4) holds a current certificate issued by the National
- 9 Council for Interior Design Qualification or holds a similar
- 10 <u>credential recognized by the board.</u>
- 11 SECTION 8. Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 12 adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
- SUBCHAPTER E. PRACTICE BY INTERIOR DESIGNER
- 14 Sec. 1053.201. RESPONSIBILITY OF AND SUPERVISION BY
- 15 INTERIOR DESIGNER. (a) Each interior design office must have an
- 16 <u>interior designer who is responsible for interior design work</u>
- 17 performed at that location.
- 18 (b) The responsible interior designer under Subsection (a)
- 19 shall supervise each nonregistered person working in the interior
- 20 design office in the practice of interior design. The supervision
- is not required to be continuous and uninterrupted.
- Sec. 1053.202. DUTIES TO CLIENT. Before entering into a
- 23 contract with a client, an interior designer must clearly determine
- the scope and nature of the project and the method of compensation.
- 25 Sec. 1053.203. COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS. Each
- 26 interior designer shall practice in compliance with all applicable
- 27 building codes, fire codes, local regulations, and other safety

- 1 requirements adopted by the board or another regulatory entity
- 2 implemented to prohibit practice by persons who:
- 3 (1) fail to practice within the bounds of minimum
- 4 <u>competency requirements; or</u>
- 5 (2) otherwise present a danger to the public.
- 6 SECTION 9. Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1053.351. CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A person commits an
- 9 offense if the person knowingly violates [Section 1053.151 or a
- 10 standard of conduct adopted under] this chapter or a rule adopted
- 11 <u>under this chapter</u>.
- 12 (b) An offense under this section is a [Class C] misdemeanor
- punishable by a fine of not less than \$250 or more than \$5,000. Each
- 14 day of violation constitutes a separate offense.
- 15 SECTION 10. Section 1053.158, Occupations Code, is
- 16 repealed.
- 17 SECTION 11. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners
- 18 shall issue a certificate of registration as an interior designer
- 19 to a person who applies for registration as an interior designer
- 20 with the board and pays the required fees before the second
- 21 anniversary of the effective date of this Act if the person presents
- 22 evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has passed the
- 23 examination of the National Council for Interior Design
- 24 Qualification or a similar national organization recognized by the
- 25 board.
- SECTION 12. (a) The change in law made by this Act to
- 27 Section 1053.351, Occupations Code, applies only to the punishment

- 1 for an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 2 For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the
- 3 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 4 before the effective date.
- 5 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 6 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 7 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 8 purpose.
- 9 SECTION 13. The Texas Board of Architectural Examiners
- shall adopt rules as required by Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, as
- amended by this Act, not later than February 1, 2008.
- 12 SECTION 14. This Act, except for Section 1051.3515,
- 13 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an
- 14 application for an initial or renewal interior designer certificate
- of registration that is filed with the Texas Board of Architectural
- 16 Examiners on or after March 1, 2008. An application filed before
- 17 March 1, 2008, is governed by the law in effect immediately before
- 18 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 19 effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 15. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 21 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
- 22 (b) Section 1051.3515, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 23 Act, takes effect September 1, 2011.
