13	(A) has sufficient funds in or on deposit with

15	order and all other checks or orders then outstanding; or
16	(B) has a history of issuing checks or other
17	sight orders for which the issuer does not have sufficient funds in
18	or on deposit with the bank or other drawee for the payment in full
19	of the check or order and all other checks or orders ther
20	outstanding.
21	(2) "Check verification entity" means a business
22	entity that provides check verification services to businesses in

- 2 presents to the check verification entity a copy of:
- 3 (1) a police report of an offense under Section 32.51,
- 4 Penal Code; or
- 5 (2) a sworn statement by the person that the person was

- 7 <u>(c) A check verification entity that violates Subsection</u>
- 8 (b) is liable to the state for a civil penalty of up to \$1,000. The
- 9 attorney general may sue to collect the penalty.
- 10 (d) The attorney general may recover reasonable expenses
- incurred in obtaining a civil penalty under this section, including
- 12 court costs, reasonable attorney's fees, investigative costs,
- 13 witness fees, and deposition expenses.
