- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 442.011, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 442.011. PENALTY. A person who violates this chapter
- 8 or Chapter 191, Natural Resources Code, is subject to a civil
- 9 penalty of not less than \$50 nor more than \$1,000 for each day of
- 10 violation.
- 11 SECTION 2. Sections 442.012(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 12 are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (a) The attorney general or any resident of this state may
- 14 file suit in district court to restrain and enjoin a violation or
- 15 threatened violation of this chapter or Chapter 191, Natural
- 16 Resources Code, to recover on behalf of the state a civil penalty
- 17 provided by this chapter, including a civil penalty provided for a
- 18 <u>violation of Chapter 191, Natural Resources Code</u>, or for both
- 19 injunctive relief and a civil penalty.
- 20 (c) If the attorney general substantially prevails in an
- 21 action to recover a civil penalty under this section, the court
- 22 shall award the attorney general reasonable expenses incurred in
- 23 recovering the penalty, including court costs, reasonable
- 24 attorney's fees, expert witness fees, and deposition expenses [In

- 1 issuing a final order in the action, the court may award costs of
- 2 litigation, including reasonable attorney's and expert witness's
- 3 fees].
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
