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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the issuance and use of temporary cardboard tags on 3 vehicles; providing penalties. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 501.022(d), Transportation Code, 5 is amended to read as follows: 6 (d) Subsection (c) does not apply to a motor vehicle 7 operated on a public highway in this state with a metal dealer's 8 license plate or a dealer's or buyer's temporary [cardboard] tag 9 attached to the vehicle as provided by Chapter 503. 10 SECTION 2. Sections 503.038(a) and (c), Transportation 11 12 Code, are amended to read as follows: department may cancel a dealer's 13 (a) The general 14 distinguishing number if the dealer: falsifies or forges a title document, including an 15 (1)affidavit making application for a certified copy of a title; 16 (2) files a false or forged tax document, including a 17 sales tax affidavit; 18 fails to take assignment of any basic evidence of 19 (3) ownership, including a certificate of title or manufacturer's 20 21 certificate, for a vehicle the dealer acquires; 22 (4) fails to assign any basic evidence of ownership, including a certificate of title or manufacturer's certificate, for 23 a vehicle the dealer sells; 24

No. 2086 1 (5) uses or permits the use of a metal dealer's license plate or a dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag on a vehicle that the 2 dealer does not own or control or that is not in stock and offered 3 4 for sale; 5 (6) makes material misrepresentation а in an 6 application or other information filed with the department; 7 (7)fails to maintain the qualifications for a general 8 distinguishing number; fails to provide to the department within 30 days 9 (8) after the date of demand by the department satisfactory and 10 reasonable evidence that the person is regularly and actively 11 engaged in business as a wholesale or retail dealer; 12 (9) has been licensed for at least 12 months and has 13 14 not assigned at least five vehicles during the previous 12-month 15 period; (10) has failed to demonstrate compliance 16 with 17 Sections 23.12, 23.121, and 23.122, Tax Code; uses or allows the use of the dealer's general (11)18 distinguishing number or the location for which the general 19 distinguishing number is issued to avoid the requirements of this 20 21 chapter; (12) misuses or allows the misuse of a temporary 22 23 [cardboard] tag authorized under this chapter; 24 (13)refuses to show on а buyer's temporary 25 [cardboard] tag the date of sale or other reasonable information 26 required by the department; or otherwise violates this chapter or a rule adopted 27 (14)

1 under this chapter.

2 person whose general distinguishing number (c) А is 3 canceled under this chapter shall surrender to a representative of the department each license, license plate, temporary [cardboard] 4 5 tag, sticker, and receipt issued under this chapter not later than 6 the 10th day after the date the general distinguishing number is 7 canceled. The department shall direct any peace officer to secure 8 and return to the department any plate, tag, sticker, or receipt of a person who does not comply with this subsection. 9

SECTION 3. The heading to Section 503.062, Transportation
Code, is amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4. Section 503.062, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows:

16 (a) A dealer may issue a temporary [cardboard] tag for use 17 on <u>a</u> [an unregistered] vehicle by the dealer or the dealer's 18 employees only to:

19 (1) demonstrate or cause to be demonstrated to a20 prospective buyer the vehicle for sale purposes only;

(2) convey or cause to be conveyed the vehicle:

(A) from one of the dealer's places of business
in this state to another of the dealer's places of business in this
state;

(B) from the dealer's place of business to a
place the vehicle is to be repaired, reconditioned, or serviced;
(C) from the state line or a location in this

state where the vehicle is unloaded to the dealer's place of 1 2 business; 3 from the dealer's place of business to a (D) 4 place of business of another dealer; 5 (E) from the point of purchase by the dealer to 6 the dealer's place of business; or 7 (F) to road test the vehicle; or use the vehicle for or allow its use by a 8 (3) 9 charitable organization. The department [may not issue a dealer temporary 10 (d) cardboard tag or contract for the issuance of a dealer temporary 11 cardboard tag but] shall prescribe[+ 12 [(1) the specifications, form, and color of a dealer 13 14 temporary cardboard tag; and 15 [(2)] the period for which a tag may be used for or by a 16 charitable organization. 17 (d-1) A dealer shall obtain temporary tags as provided by Section 503.0635. 18 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 503.0625, Transportation 19 Code, is amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 503.0625. CONVERTER'S TEMPORARY [CARDBOARD] TAGS. 21 SECTION 6. Sections 503.0625(b), (e), 22 and (f), Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows: 23 24 (b) A converter may issue a temporary [cardboard] tag for 25 use on an unregistered vehicle by the converter or the converter's 26 employees only to: 27 (1) demonstrate or cause to be demonstrated to a

No. 2086 1 prospective buyer who is an employee of a franchised motor vehicle 2 dealer the vehicle; or 3 (2) convey or cause to be conveyed the vehicle: 4 (A) from one of the converter's places of 5 business in this state to another of the converter's places of business in this state; 6 7 (B) from the converter's place of business to a 8 place the vehicle is to be assembled, repaired, reconditioned, modified, or serviced; 9 (C) from the state line or a location in this 10 state where the vehicle is unloaded to the converter's place of 11 12 business; from the converter's place of business to a 13 (D) 14 place of business of a franchised motor vehicle dealer; or 15 (E) to road test the vehicle. A converter shall obtain temporary tags as provided by 16 (e) 17 Section 503.0635 [The department may not issue a converter temporary cardboard tag or contract for the issuance of a converter 18 temporary cardboard tag but shall prescribe the specifications, 19 form, and color of a converter temporary cardboard tag]. 20 21 (f) A converter or employee of a converter may not use a [cardboard] tag issued under this 22 temporary section as authorization to operate a vehicle for the converter's or the 23 24 employee's personal use. SECTION 7. Section 503.063, Transportation Code, is amended 25 26 to read as follows:

27 Sec. 503.063. BUYER'S TEMPORARY [CARDBOARD] TAGS. (a) <u>At</u>

1	the time of delivery of a vehicle to the buyer or lessee of the
2	[Except as provided by this section, a dealer may issue to a person
3	who buys an unregistered] vehicle, a dealer shall issue one
4	temporary [cardboard] buyer's tag for the vehicle.
5	(b) <u>The</u> [Except as provided by this section, the] buyer's
6	tag is valid for the operation of the vehicle <u>on a public highway</u>
7	until the earlier of:
8	(1) the date on which the vehicle is registered; or
9	(2) the 45 th [21 st] day after the date of purchase.
10	(c) The dealer[+
11	[(1) must show in ink on the buyer's tag the actual
12	date of sale and any other required information; and
13	[(2)] is responsible for <u>affixing</u> [displaying] the tag
14	to the vehicle.
15	(d) <u>A dealer shall obtain buyer's temporary tags as provided</u>
16	by Section 503.0635. The dealer is responsible for the safekeeping
17	and distribution of each buyer's tag the dealer obtains.
18	[(e) The department may not issue a buyer's tag or contract
19	for the issuance of a buyer's tag but shall prescribe the
20	specifications, color, and form of a buyer's tag.
21	[(f) A dealer may issue an additional temporary cardboard
22	buyer's tag to a person after the expiration of 21 days after the
23	issue of a temporary cardboard buyer's tag, and the person may
24	operate the vehicle for which the tag was issued on the additional
25	temporary cardboard buyer's tag if the dealer has been unable to
26	obtain on behalf of the vehicle's owner the necessary documents to
27	obtain permanent metal license plates because the documents are in

1	the possession of a lienholder who has not complied with the terms
2	of Section 501.115(a) of this code. An additional tag issued under
3	the terms of this subsection is valid for a maximum of 21 days after
4	the date of issue.]
5	SECTION 8. Subchapter C, Chapter 503, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 503.0635 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 503.0635. PRODUCTION AND ISSUANCE OF TEMPORARY TAGS.
8	(a) The department may produce all dealer's, converter's, and
9	buyer's temporary tags and issue the tags to dealers or converters,
10	as appropriate.
11	(b) The department may contract to have temporary tags
12	produced or issued to dealers or converters by one or more private
13	or public entities. Temporary tags may be issued to dealers or
14	converters electronically.
15	(c) If the department chooses to produce and issue temporary
16	tags under this chapter, the department shall establish a
17	reasonable fee for the production and issuance of the tags that may
18	not be less than the amount necessary to allow the department to
19	recover all costs to the department associated with producing and
20	issuing the temporary tags. The fee charged for the temporary
21	buyer's tag is payable by the purchaser of a vehicle at the time of
22	sale as a separate contract item.
23	(d) If the department chooses to produce and issue temporary
24	tags under this chapter, the commission shall adopt rules for the
25	administration of the process.
26	(e) If the department does not adopt rules under Subsection
27	<u>(d):</u>

1	(1) a dealer may produce a dealer's or buyer's
2	temporary tag as prescribed by department rule;
3	(2) a converter may produce a converter's temporary
4	tag as prescribed by department rule; and
5	(3) the commission by rule shall prescribe the
6	specifications, form, material, and color to be used for each type
7	of temporary tag.
8	SECTION 9. Section 503.067, Transportation Code, is amended
9	to read as follows:
10	Sec. 503.067. UNAUTHORIZED REPRODUCTION OF TEMPORARY
11	[CARDBOARD] TAGS. (a) Except as authorized by Section 503.0635(e),
12	<u>a</u> [A] person [other than a dealer] may not produce or reproduce a
13	[buyer's or dealer's] temporary [cardboard] tag.
14	(b) A person may not operate a vehicle that displays an
15	unauthorized temporary [cardboard] tag.
16	SECTION 10. Sections 503.068(a), (b), and (c),
17	Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
18	(a) A dealer or an employee of a dealer may not use a
19	dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag as authorization to operate a
20	vehicle for the dealer's or the employee's personal use.
21	(b) A person may not use a metal dealer's license plate or
22	dealer's temporary [cardboard] tag on:
23	(1) a service or work vehicle; or
24	(2) a commercial vehicle that is carrying a load.
25	(c) For purposes of this section, a boat trailer carrying a
26	boat is not a commercial vehicle carrying a load. A dealer
27	complying with this chapter may affix to the rear of a boat trailer

Section 503.069(a), Transportation Code, is 3 SECTION 11. 4 amended to read as follows: 5 (a) A license plate, other than an in-transit license plate, 6 or a temporary [cardboard] tag issued under this chapter shall be displayed in accordance with commission [board] rules. 7 SECTION 12. Section 503.094, Transportation 8 Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to 9 read as follows: 10 Except as provided by Subsection (d), an [An] offense 11 (b) 12 under this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$5,000. 13 14 (d) An offense that is a violation of Section 503.067 is a 15 Class A misdemeanor. SECTION 13. Section 601.002(12), Transportation Code, is 16 17 amended to read as follows: (12) "Vehicle registration" means: 18 19 (A) a registration certificate, registration receipt, or number plate issued under Chapter 502; or 20 21 (B) а dealer's license plate or temporary [cardboard] tag issued under Chapter 503. 22 SECTION 14. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective 23 24 date of this Act, the Texas Transportation Commission shall adopt rules to implement Section 503.0635, Transportation Code, as added 25 26 by this Act. 27 (b) The Texas Department of Transportation may not enforce

Section 503.0635, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, until 1 2 the rules adopted under Subsection (a) of this section take effect. 3 SECTION 15. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections 4 503.067 and 503.094, Transportation Code, apply to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense 5 6 committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is 7 8 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 9 any element of the offense was committed before that date. 10 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
