- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 663.037, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 7 follows:

- 8 (d) The operator of an all-terrain vehicle may drive the
- 9 vehicle on a public street, road, or highway that is not an
- 10 interstate or limited-access highway if:
- 11 (1) the transportation is in connection with:
- 12 <u>(A)</u> the production, cultivation, care,
- 13 harvesting, preserving, drying, processing, canning, storing,
- 14 handling, shipping, marketing, selling, or use of agricultural
- products, as defined by Section 52.002, Agriculture Code; or
- 16 (B) utility work performed by a utility;
- 17 (2) the operator attaches to the back of the vehicle on
- top of an eight-foot-long pole a triangular orange flag;
- 19 (3) the vehicle's headlights and taillights are
- 20 illuminated;
- 21 (4) the operator holds a driver's license, as defined
- 22 by Section 521.001;
- 23 (5) the operation of the all-terrain vehicle occurs in
- 24 the daytime; and

- 1 (6) the operation of the all-terrain vehicle does not
- 2 exceed a distance of 25 miles from the point of origin to the
- 3 destination.
- 4 (d-1) Provisions of this code regarding helmet and eye
- 5 protection use, safety certification, and other vehicular
- 6 restrictions do not apply to <u>Subsection (d)</u> [this subsection].
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
