A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a late fee charged in connection with the inspection of

- 3 a vehicle with an invalid inspection certificate.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 548.258(b), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The department may adopt rules to require an inspection
- 8 station to use TexasOnline to:
- 9 (1) purchase inspection certificates; [or]
- 10 (2) send to the department a record, report, or other
 11 information required by the department;
- in information required by the department.
- 12 (3) send fees to the department under Section 548.509;
- 13 (4) determine the expiration date of the most recent
- 14 inspection certificate issued for a vehicle, if the vehicle does
- 15 not display an inspection certificate; or
- 16 (5) if authorized or required by the department, waive
- 17 a fee due from the owner of an inspected vehicle under Section
- 18 <u>548.509</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 548, Transportation Code,
- 20 is amended by adding Sections 548.509 and 548.510 to read as
- 21 follows:
- Sec. 548.509. LATE INSPECTION FEE. (a) In addition to any
- other inspection fee provided by this subchapter, and except as
- 24 provided by Subsection (c), for each 30-day period or part of a

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- 1 30-day period following the date an inspection certificate
- 2 displayed on a vehicle ceases to be valid, a late inspection fee in
- 3 an amount equal to 1/12 of the fee due from the vehicle owner for the
- 4 certificate shall be assessed and collected.
- 5 (b) If the vehicle does not display an expired inspection
- 6 certificate and the department is unable to determine the
- 7 expiration date of the most recent inspection certificate issued
- 8 for the vehicle using the Texas Automated Vehicle Inspection
- 9 System, the motor vehicle inspection database in a county
- 10 participating in a program established by Subchapter F, or the
- 11 vehicle inspection report, the amount of the fee under Subsection
- 12 (a) is equal to the fee due from the vehicle owner under this
- 13 subchapter for the certificate that is subsequently attached to or
- 14 produced for the vehicle.
- (c) A late fee under Subsection (a) may not be assessed or
- 16 <u>collected if the inspection certificate has been expired for five</u>
- days or less.
- 18 (d) In addition to the fee provided by Subsection (a), the
- inspection station shall assess and may retain a \$3 administrative
- 20 fee.
- (e) Each fee collected under Subsection (a) shall be sent to
- the department not later than the 10th day of the month following
- the month in which the fee is collected.
- 24 (f) The department shall prohibit a vehicle inspection
- station that does not send to the department each fee required under
- 26 Subsection (e) on or before the 15th day of the month in which the
- 27 fee is due from conducting vehicle inspections until all required

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- 1 fees are sent. The department shall enforce this subsection by
- 2 locking out the inspection station's Texas Automated Vehicle
- 3 Inspection System interface device or emissions testing analyzer,
- 4 <u>as applicable.</u>
- 5 (g) A vehicle inspection station that does not send each
- 6 required fee on or before the 15th day of the month in which the fee
- 7 <u>is due may not purchase a vehicle inspection certificate until all</u>
- 8 required fees are sent.
- 9 Sec. 548.510. LATE INSPECTION FEE EXEMPTIONS. A late fee
- 10 under Section 548.509 may not be assessed or collected if:
- 11 (1) the vehicle owner is an active member of the United
- 12 States Armed Forces or the National Guard and was on duty outside
- 13 this state on the date the inspection certificate expired;
- 14 (2) the vehicle or vehicle owner qualifies for a
- waiver from program requirements under Section 382.203, Health and
- 16 Safety Code; or
- 17 (3) the vehicle owner applies for and receives a
- 18 waiver from the department:
- 19 (A) for an economic hardship;
- 20 (B) for a medical condition; or
- (C) because the vehicle was proven to be
- 22 <u>inoperable.</u>
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
